Kezman getting

SOCCERNET Mateja Kezman has been summoned to appear before the Paris St Germain board to explain his angry shirtthrowing gesture during Wednesday night's 3-0 defeat by Bordeaux in the Coupe de

la Ligue semi-final at the Parc des Princes. The Serbia striker was substituted in the 59th minute of the match, only moments after squandering a gilt-edged chance to score

what would have been an

equaliser to make it 1-1. The miss provoked whistles of derision from the home supporters and, as he was being substituted, Kezman tossed his jersey on the ground before jogging past the PSG bench and straight down the tunnel.

The striker issued an immediate apology in front of the press after the match, but that is not expected to spare him.

A PSG statement read: "Following the meeting between PSG and Bordeaux, Mateja Kezman will on Friday meet the coach (Paul Le Guen) as well as the club's board to explain his gesture.

"The club will then reveal the subsequent sanctions."

Kezman has been unable to secure a regular place in PSG's starting line-up since joining the club last summer, and has often been the subject of jeers from supporters.

He admitted that partly explained his wild reaction.

"I made a mistake. Maybe something like that has never happened here, but I am a person with a strong character living one of the most difficult moments of my football life since arriving here," he said. "Everyone needs to know that this has nothing to do with the club, the fans or the shirt; this was a reaction of anger at myself."

Paris will only serve to continue her slide down the world rankings. Sharapova slipped out of

the top 10 on Monday for the first time since winning Wimbledon in July 2004 and is ranked 17th.

In Sharapova's absence, the tournament's biggest draws will be recentlycrowned Australian Open champion and new world number one Serena Williams, Olympic champion Elena Dementieva and the Frenchwomen Alize Cornet and Amelie Mauresmo.

Gerrard blow for Reds

Steven Gerrard will miss three weeks of Liverpool's Premiership title campaign after picking up a hamstring injury in Wednesday's 1-0 FA Cup defeat by city rivals Everton, his club said Thursday.

"A scan today has confirmed a tear in the hamstring of Steven's left leg. He will be out of action for about three weeks," a club spokesman told Liverpoolfc.tv.

The 28-year-old limped off after just 16 minutes of the fourth-round replay at Goodison Park and now looks set to miss the club's next two league encounters against Portsmouth and Manchester City, as well as England's friendly against Spain next week.

Gerrard's absence is a big blow as Liverpool, whose last league title came in 1990, chase reigning champions Manchester United, who lead them by two points with a game in hand.

If United retain their title they will join Liverpool on 18 championships. Sir Alex Ferguson's side

have won the trophy ten times since Liverpool's last success.

Micah Richards, the Manchester City and England defender, has been arrested on suspicion of assaulting a teenager outside a nightclub, police said Thursday.

Richards, 20, was interviewed on Wednesday by officers investigating an incident in which an 18-year-old male was assaulted in the Manchester suburb of Hale in the early hours of December 24.

Richards was bailed until April 8 pending the completion of inquiries which will allow the police to decide whether he should face any charges.

The defender's arrest adds to a growing list of off-field headaches faced by City manager Mark Hughes.
