### Kinnear in hospital

Newcastle boss Joe Kinnear was admitted to hospital on Saturday after complaining of feeling unwell.

The 62-year-old, who has a history of ill health, was examined by medical staff "as a precautionary measure" and was being kept in for observation, the club reported.

He was examined by the club's medical staff before going to hospital," a Newcastle spokesman added.

Newcastle assistant manager Chris Hughton will take charge for the game against West Brom at The Hawthorns later Saturday.

Kinnear suffered a mild heart attack when in charge of Wimbledon in 1999, later resigning from that post due to poorhealth.

#### Tevez faces fine

Manchester United star Carlos Tevez has had his £140,000 Bentley impounded by police after he was pulled over and found to not possess a UK driving licence.

Greater Manchester Police stopped Argentina forward Tevez on the M60 near Stretford, believing the tint on the windows of his white Bentley Continental GT Speed to be illegal.

Tests subsequently conducted by police showed that they were too dark.

A GMP spokesman said: "Shortly after 9.20am on Friday 6 February 2009, traffic officers pulled over a Bentley close to junction 7 of the M60. "The officers were con-

cerned certain windows were illegally tinted. They were tested and found to be too dark so a prohibition notice was issued to the driver.

"When asked to provide his documentation, it was discovered the driver did not have a full UK driving licence and was advised to arrange

removal of the car. "As he could not arrange this, the car was removed under Section 165 of Road

Traffic Act 1988." Tevez, 25, could therefore face prosecution, with a maximum fine of £1,000 as well as

six penalty points. In 2007 Tevez's United teammate Cristiano Ronaldo was fined for having too-dark windows on his Bentley convertible, while the Portuguese was stopped by police again as recently as Thursday and warned over his speed.


