Later Moshiur's friends Rajib, 23, Bhulu, 23, Manik, 25, Ranjit Ghosh, 25 and Mosharraf, 26 raped her one after another. Mashiur recorded its video on their cellphone.

A case has been filed with Dhamrai Police Station on Friday in this regard.

The criminals are threatening the victim and her family members and displaying the video footage to the people that forced the girl to stop going to the school.
