Bangladesh-Canada trade to reach a new high: Envoy

Trade between Bangladesh and Canada is expected to cross the billion-dollar mark this year, said Robert McDougall, Canadian high commissioner in Bangladesh, yesterday.

Currently, trade between the countries stands at nearly \$900 million.

The projection was made in a paper read out by the high commissioner at a monthly luncheon meeting of the Foreign Investors' Chamber of Commerce and Industry (Ficci) at Sonargaon Hotel in Dhaka.

Speaking as chief guest, the diplomat said Canada and Bangladesh share bright prospects for cooperation in technology and energy security issues.

"In this regard, we are particularly focusing on expansion in a number of areas, including diversification of our exports and activities in business collaboration," McDougall said.

The high commissioner said Canada's thrust areas for investment in Bangladesh would be IT for a digital Bangladesh, CNG distribution, communications system development and power generation.

Examine the benefits from transit before signing deal

Speakers urge govt at seminar

The government should at first analyse the benefits the country may get from allowing transit to India before signing any deal, speakers said at a seminar in Dhaka yesterday.

They said the government should be well prepared for multilateral talks and strengthen its bargaining capacity while going for any negotiation.

The seminar on 'Strengthening Cooperation between Bangladesh and India: Connectivity through Trade, Transit and Other Issues' was organised by Bangladesh Unnayan Parishad (BUP).

Brig Gen (retd) Shahedul Anam, defence and strategic affairs editor of The Daily Star, said the government should take better preparation and strengthen bargaining power considering the geopolitical reality that gives privilege to Bangladesh before going for any multilateral or bilateral talks.

"Whenever the government goes for any negotiation, it must remember that the geopolitical location of the country makes it important in South Asian politics and strategies that we have to exploit on the discussion table," he said.

"The main thing is ensuring and upholding the national interest prior to allowing transit to India, and the governfrom it," Shahedul Anam added.

He said the government should consider the national security along with national interests on priority basis before going for any new talks or treaties.

"In addition, the government must have an opportunity

cost analysis before allowing transit to India," he said, adding that the government should have plan on removing nontariff barriers and setting free products from the negative list

CM Shafi Sami, former foreign secretary, said the government should consider the economic development of the country that might be gained from allowing transit to India.

"Both the countries should join hands to eliminate mistrust over bilateral relation that creates barriers to implementing many treaties that would help us to further strengthen the economic situation of the country," he said.

The government should have specific visions from allowing transit to India, such as attracting new investments and encouraging joint ventures from Indian side, he added.

Mir Nasir Hossain, former FBCCI president, said the government should work hard to reduce trade deficit between India and Bangladesh.

In fiscal year 2007-08 India exported goods worth \$3.375 billion to Bangladesh and imported \$358.08 million worth products, the seminar was told.

US Treasury to prop up housing under revamped bank bailout

President Barack Obama's administration will Tuesday unveil a new plan for the frozen banking sector including at least 50 billion dollars to shore up the housing market, a top aide said Sunday.

National Economic Council director Larry Summers said the plan to be announced by Treasury Secretary Timothy Geithner would provide "support for banks so that they remain stable, are in a position to lend.

"There will be support for the credit markets more generally," he told ABC television.

"And absolutely critically, there will be support and pressure that assures that these needless foreclosures are avoided and that government is acting aggressively to contain the damage in the housing markets."


Geithner was initially reported to be planning to roll out his new measures, revamping the second half of a 700-billion-dollar financial bailout called the Troubled Asset Relief Program (TARP), on Monday.

Asked about indications that Geithner would instead make his announcement Tuesday, Summers said: "Yes, I think there's a desire to keep the focus right now on the economic recovery program, which is so very, very important."

With the Senate battling to seal an enormous stimulus plan demanded by Obama, the president was Monday to lobby for the bill in Indiana before giving a prime-time news conference in the evening.

Summers declined to get into details of the new TARP relief ahead of Geithner's announcement, but said a large chunk of it would go to housing.

"The president's made clear that he's very committed to (preventing) foreclosures. I expect that it will be 50 billion dollars or more that will be directed at providing support for the housing sector of our economy, he said.
