Newly wed woman succumbs

A newly married housewife succumbed to her burns yesterday after fighting for life for seven days at The City Hospital in Dhaka.

The victim, Kamrun Nahar Sukhi, 23, sustained severe burns at the house of her husband Mukur Chowdhury, vice-president of Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD), at Balubari in Dinajpur town on February 6. She got married on January

Her family alleged that her husband set her on fire. But the JCD leader denied the allegation.

But the police could not confirm whether it was a case of suicide or murder.

Quoting the domestic help of the house, the police said she saw Sukhi groaning in her bed while her husband wrapping her with a wet blanket.

Later, locals rushed her to Dinajpur Medical College and Hospital. She was shifted to The City Hospital the next day. Hospital sources said 75 percent of her body was burnt.

Our Dinajpur correspondent adds: The police told reporters that the blanket and the dresses of Sukhi smelled of

kerosene. Sukhi's family members alleged that Mukur poured kerosene on her and set fire to her following a quarrel between them.

None was arrested in this connection.

PSC introduces new system for BCS exam

The Public Service Commission (PSC) is going to introduce a new system for form collection, submission and issuing admit card for BCS examinations to cut in the time limit for procedural matters.

As per the new system, man candidates will collect application forms from the designated branches of the Sonali Bank located under their desired examination centre. After completing the appli-

cation forms with necessary documents, the candidates will submit them to deputy commissioners who will issue the admit card on the same

yesterday, PSC Chairman Dr Saadat Hussain said this new system will be applicable from the upcoming 29th Bangladesh Civil Service (BCS) Examination.

The application forms for this examination will be available at 30 branches of Sonali Bank across the country from March 10 to April 26.

Lack of coordination between agencies concerned is the main reason behind the miserable condition of traffic system in the capital, said Dhaka City Corporation (DCC) Mayor Sadeque Hossain Khoka yesterday.

"The system of keeping various agencies involved in the city's traffic management must be abolished," Khoka said at a workshop on 'Traffic Congestion in Dhaka City: An impediment to Prosperity' at the DCC.

Engineering and Technology (Buet) jointly organised the workshop.

Iranian government has expressed interest in setting up a hospital and a university in Bangladesh.

Iranian Ambassador Hassan Farazandeh said this when he called on Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina at her office in the city yesterday.

The envoy formally handed over a letter of felicitation from Iranian President Mahmoud Ahmadinejad to Hasina on her assumption of office as the prime minister.

Apprising the PM of various development projects of Iran in Bangladesh, Ambassador Farazandeh said Iran wants to set up one hospital and one university in Bangladesh.

Besides, Iran is also interested to invest in larger volume in various development sectors here, he said.

Hasina and the Iranian ambassador recalled the glorious history of long cultural ties between Iran and Bangladesh and hoped that the friendly bilateral relations will be strengthened further in the days to come.

CJ to refrain from hearing appeals against HC verdict

Chief Justice MM Ruhul Amin vesterday decided not to hear further the appeals against the High Court (HC) judgement declaring illegal the appointment of Kazi Habibul Awal as acting law secretary.

Some lawyers present at the court said the chief justice decided to refrain from hearing the appeals following the submissions made by Awal's counsel Barrister M Amir-Ul Islam, who raised question on the neutrality of the chief justice with regard to the hearing of this case.

Now the four-member full bench of the Appellate Division without the chief justice will hear the appeals. The apex court yesterday fixed February 23 as the next date for hearing the appeals.

Earlier, the five-member full bench of the apex court headed by the chief justice held the hearing on the appeals for three days.

During the hearing in last three days, Amir-Ul Islam told the court that the chief justice on July 6 last year received a written statement submitted by the leaders of Bangladesh Judicial Service Association (BJSA) on some demands, including the removal of Kazi Habibul Awal from the office of the law secretary.

The chief justice accepted the memorandum in his administrative capacity, Amir-

Barrister Ajmalul Hossain, counsel for the writ petitioner, told the court yesterday that the chief justice, as the head of the judiciary, can hear any case. The HC on February 18 last
