Death of parents leaves Dipa shell-shocked

Struck dumb with shock and trauma, Dipa, who was injured in a road accident in Bandarban on Thursday, stares with a vacant look as relatives thronged her Sholokbahar residence in the port city yesterday morning to offer their deepest sympathies.

Dipa was brought home yesterday from Chittagong Medical College Hospital (CMCH) to have a last glimpse of her father Siddique Hossain Chowdhury and mother Dilwara Begum before they were sent out for burial at their village home at Bengura under Boalkhali upazila.


