

RDA's water use model gets global recognition

WB invites RDA to present the model at its HQ on Feb 19

Rural Development Academy (RDA), Bogra, is to present RDA-Model of Water Management at the World Bank headquarters in Washington, DC on February 19 for its adaptation across the globe.

The water management model uses underground pipes to irrigate fields and distribute drinking water to households from deep tube-wells which drastically reduce wastage of water.

The World Bank (WB) invited the RDA, a government organisation, to present its paper on the model at the Water Week 2009 scheduled for February 17-20 at its headquarters in the US capital.

WB Sector Manager of Water Anchor Energy and Water and Transport Abel Mejia and Senior Water and Sanitation Specialist and Water Anchor Water Week 2009 Coordinator Philippe Marin sent the invitation letter to MA Matin, director of Centre for Irrigation and Water Management of RDA, Bogra.

Matin started an experimental irrigation programme

named Buried Pipe Irrigation System in 1982 at Narhatta village of Kahalu upazila in Bogra to ensure more water to villagers, save electricity and minimise cost.

Initially the system saved 60 kilowatts of power. It covered 67 hectares of land instead of just 16 and saved six lakh litres of water every hour.

In 1987, the second phase of the experimental programme was introduced at Shasibadani village in Bogra Sadar. In the second phase the facility of drinking water distribution from the same deep tube well was added.

"One deep tube well provided drinking water for 2,200 people and ensured irrigation water for 60 hectares of land in the village," said Matin.

"Barind Multipurpose Development Authority (BMDA), Local Government Engineering Department (LGED) and Bangladesh Agriculture Development Corporation (BADC) along with other government establishments have started replicating the RDA model throughout the country," he added.

The RDA used the model in more than 200 villages in 55

districts, sources said.

A large amount of government money is being saved as the deep tube wells and the pipe network is owned by beneficiaries, claimed Matin. "For example the RDA completed a water supply project with eight deep tube wells at a cost of Tk 16 lakh on both side of the Bangabandhu Bridge. The government in 1998 planned to complete the project spending Tk 1.36 crore," he said.

The RDA also implemented an arsenic- and iron-free water supply project on Jamuna Fertiliser Company premises at Tarakandi in Jamalpur spending Tk 3.25 crore whereas Japan wanted nearly 10 times more to complete the automatic water supply project, Matin claimed.

Jahangir Hossain, 40, a beneficiary of the model, of Garh Mohasthan village of Shibganj upazila in Bogra told The Daily Star that he harvests 6.75 tonnes of boro paddy from his one hectare of land on an average. "Before this irrigation system, there was no boro cultivation in the area," he said.

Sayda Begum, 35, wife of Mohammed Dulu Miah of the same village, said her family is now better protected against waterborne diseases as drinking water is supplied to her home through pipes.

"Most of the villagers were suffering from waterborne diseases before," she said. The RDA has been supplying drinking and irrigation water to the village for six years.

Deep tube well owner Jahangir said, "We have been providing arsenic- and iron-free drinking water for monthly Tk 10 per person. Each person gets 150 litres of water a day."

The RDA gave him the total cost of the well as soft loan, Matin said.

WB consultant Elizabeth Kleemeier and a few other WB water supply experts visited several project sites and recommended replicating the model worldwide, he added.

Before signing the Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) in 2002 to replicate this model worldwide, Jamal Sagor, director of Energy and Water of WB headquarters visited Basu Bihara village of Shibganj in Bogra.

were the parties concerned in the case, none of them were included or interrogated by the IOs during their investigations carried out for over four and a half years.

"A chain of command among the parties had definitely worked at that time for giving safe passage to the arms consignment inside Bangladesh and the IO should focus on these issues during the investigation," said senior lawyer Rana Das Gupta, who stands for the accused in the case.

Persons like former home minister Lutfozzaman Babar, former industries minister Matiar Rahman Nizami, the then officials from CUFL, Customs, CPA, Coast Guard and Navy can't skip their responsibility, he added.

Referring to the court's directives, he said scrutiny of the port's berthing list of vessels and inquiring role of coast guards, navy men and customs officials during the incident is necessary.

"Once the vessel, which carried the arms cache to the outer anchorage, could be identified then it will be easy to know the details, including the nature of the cargo, the names of the captain and crews, shipping agents etc," Rana Das said.

"The owners of the trawlers (FV Khazar Dan and FV Shah Amanat) should have been also quizzed as per court directives to know name of point at the outer anchorage and the vessel from where they loaded the arms into their trawlers," he said.

He alleged that there are

weaknesses and loopholes in the case as the IOs had skipped all these vital points during the investigation.

Public Prosecutor Ahsanul Hoque Hena alleged: "After the arms haul, two separate cases were filed, one under section-25/B of the Special Power Act for arms smuggling and the other under section-19 (ka) of the Arms Act. But it should be a single case under-25/B of the Special Power Act where the section-19 (ka) could have been included."

Pointing out the recent comments made by State Minister for Home Affairs Tanjim Ahmed Sohel Taj, both Hena and Rana Das stressed the need for active involvement of government to help bring a real headway or breakthrough in the case as the IO alone can't do enough.

They suggested formation of a strong monitoring cell or special team by the government to assist the IO in unearthing the mysteries of arms haul.

Sources said the new IO Md Moniruzzaman, ASP of CID, is yet to start his investigation into the case.

Earlier, two cases were filed with the Karnaphuli police station after the arms and ammunition were seized during off-loading from the boats at CUFL Jetty on April 2, 2004.

One of the cases was lodged under section-25/B of the Special Power Act for arms smuggling and the other under section-19 (ka) of the Arms Act.

However, out of the 43 accused in the two cases, all except two are now on bail.

As she wanted to know about problems of Ansar and VDP, some senior officers demanded of the premier to give them "self-commanding power", include them in the UN peace-keeping mission and give them authority of investigation like the police department for "ensuring justice" in the rural areas.

In reply, Hasina said the government is considering setting up a separate structure for investigation within the police department. Ansar can be made a part of that separate investigation structure, she added.

She directed the home ministry to think what can be done to accommodate Ansar and VDP in the envisaged separate investigation mechanism.

About the demand regarding UN mission, she said though the choice of forces for sending in the peacekeeping missions totally depends on the UN authorities, she herself would look into the matter and try to take steps.

Hasina stressed the need for identifying fields of demands for human resources on the international market and sending abroad well-trained workforce.

She suggested the Ansar and VDP authorities to set up a Nursing Training Institute in the Ansar-VDP Academy Hospital

as such initiative will help create employment opportunities for the Ansar-VDP women members.

The country could earn huge foreign currency by sending skill nurses to different countries as house-keeping jobs are now widely acclaimed and standard jobs abroad, she said.

The PM also inaugurated the newly installed operation theatre of Bangladesh Ansar Academy Hospital.

Sheikh Hasina noted that a new dimension in security paradigm has emerged in the present-day world and said Bangladesh would have to attain competence in military sector to fit in the new order.

Also, she said, the nation needs to be built as a well-organised one imbued with a strong spirit of patriotism.

She told the function that the government will reform and modernise the Ansar and VDP by providing professional training and infrastructural development, including removing vehicle problems and increasing budgetary allocation for the development of human resources.

Hasina said she has a personal thinking about creating a trained, conscious and patriotic citizenry in every village through the nation-building activity of the Ansar-VDP force.

"From now, you (Ansar, VDP) will play the key role in implementing all development and service programmes in the villages as government representatives," she said.

She urged the Ansar commanders, VDP's union and village team leaders to create anti-terrorism public opinion to establish the rule of law.

She asked them to help bring the "derailed" youths into the path of light.

"You will be the pathfinders for the rural people who will attain qualities of a good citizen, establish the qualities in own families and spread these to other families of the village," she said.

By doing this, Ansar and VDP will create thousands of laborious, honest and sacrificing citizens across the country, she said, redefining their roles. She urged the officers to take various innovative programmes to implement government's aim of building a modern digital Bangladesh by the year 2021.

Earlier, the prime minister addressed the 29th National Rally of Bangladesh Ansar and VDP at the parade ground of the Shafipur Ansar Academy.

On her arrival at the academy, Home Minister Advocate Sahara Khatun received the prime minister who inspected the parade of a smart contingent of Ansar and VDP members
