27 killed as cargo ship rams launch

Over a dozen still missing; capsized vessel salvaged

Twenty seven bodies were recovered and more than a dozen are still missing after an overcrowded launch, being hit by a cargo vessel, sank in the Kirtonkhola in Barisal yesterday.

The launch was carrying over 100 passengers, sources said.

Witnesses said 35 to 40 people managed to swim ashore from mid-river. The river is about half-a-km wide at the spot, near Beltola-Charabdani Kheya Ghat. They said many drowned trying to swim to the shore.

Rescue vessels of Bangladesh Inland Water Transport Authority (BIWTA) pulled out the launch ML Fahmida Happy Express around 5:00pm, about 11 hours this morning. afteritwent down.

onlookers, were waiting on the riverbank looking for their loved ones. Many were grieving the loss of their dear ones.

Hayatul Islam, assistant commissioner of Barisal Metropolitan Police, told The Daily Star around 8:45pm yesterday that 27 bodies were recovered.

BIWTA divers suspended their search around 6:30pm due to poor light. Police

and fire service officials, however, kept searching for bodies and survivors till 10:30pm. They are to resume their search

Harun lands in jail

A Dhaka court yesterday rejected a bail petition from BNP lawmaker Harunur Rashid and sent him to jail after he surrendered before the court and sought bail in a forgery case.

Metropolitan Magistrate Rashed Kabir passed the order after the lawmaker from Chandpur-4 constituency appeared before the court with his lawyer Advocate Golam Mostafa Khan.

Another BNP leader from Chandpur Mohammad Abdul Hannan filed the case against Rashid with Ramna Police station on January 5 this year on charges of bringing false allegations against him (the complainant).

FORGERY CASE BNP lawmaker DCs left out of by-poll duties

EC takes landmark decision to hold March 30 elections with own staff

For the first time in its history, the Election Commission (EC) has appointed its own officials as returning and assistant returning officers to conduct by-election to seven constituencies on March 30.

Usually, the deputy commissioners (DC) are appointed ROs and upazila executive officers AROs for both general and by-elections.

This time the commission has picked its divisional deputy election commissioners and district election officers as ROs and district election officers as AROs.

Explaining the rationale behind the move, Election Commissioner Brig Gen (retd) M Sakhawat Hossain yesterday said they took the decision in light of the past experience.

Political observers say most of the by-

elections under the previous political governments were mired in controversy because DCs and UEOs did not do enough to stave off politicalinterference.

Brig Sakhawat said, "The commission wants the election officials to be directly accountable to it. This is why it has assigned its own officials to work as returning and assistant returning officers."

In future, more and more ROs and AROs will be appointed from among EC officials, he

The EC Secretariat on Wednesday published gazette notifications on the appointments.

Rangpur-3 and -6, Kurigram-2, Bogra-6 and -7, Bagerhat-1 and Kishoreganj-6 are the constituencies going to by-election. They fell vacant after President Zillur Rahman, Prime

The premier explained her newly elected government's plans for building a new-look defence force and policy while addressing the certificate-awarding ceremony for 2008-09 sessions of the Defence Services Command and Staff College (DSCSC) at Mirpur Cantonment.

DSCSC Commandant Maj Gen Iqbal Karim Bhuiyan received

her in the morning at the college ground.

Hasina noted that the armed forces are the symbol of country's independence and sovereignty, and a rethinking about upgrading their capabilities suiting newer security paradigms is an imperative.

Sources said they were prevented from leaving the country on orders of the government. According to the sources, there is a list of over 60 people who are not allowed to leave the country.

Mojahid and Babar are accused in several cases and Babar

has already been convicted in several of them.

Sources said Babar, along with one of his sisters and nephews, reached ZIA around 12:30pm. But immigration officials informed him of the prohibition on his departure. They left ZIA


