
Route map for Shaheed Minar, Azimpur Graveyard



Mamun's detention illegal

Declares HC

The High Court (HC) yesterday declared the detention of controversial businessman Giasuddin Al Mamun illegal.

A division bench of the HC comprising justices Syed Mahmud Hossain and Quamrul Islam Siddiqui also asked the government to release Mamun immediately from jail if he is not arrested in any other cases.

Mamun, a close friend of former premier Khaleda Zia's elder son Tarique Rahman, was arrested on March 25, 2007 during the interregnum period of the immediate past caretaker rule.

The HC judgment came upon a habeas corpus petition filed by Mamun's brother Jalaluddin Rumi challenging the legality of the detention

order against Mamun. Barrister Fakhrul Islam, a lawyer for the petitioner, yesterday told The Daily Star that Mamun could not be released from jail following the HC verdict since he was

arrested in other cases. He said a total of 19 cases were filed against Mamun after his arrest and he secured bails from the HC in all cases but the Supreme Court stayed eight bail orders, he added.

The immediate past military backed caretaker government on January 4 issued a 30day detention order against Mamun.

Barrister Shamsuddin Chowdhury Manik appeared for the petitioner.

Five days after the gruesome murder, detective police arrested Eden College student Poly's killer from the Stadium market area in Paltan yesterday.

The DB police have also recovered the victim's cell phone set and knives apparently used to kill her, from the possession of AKM Nahidul Baksa who has confessed to killingher.

After his arrest, AKM Nahidul Baksa, 30, confessed that he had murdered Poly and based on information given by him, police recovered Poly's cell phone set from his house at

They also recovered a blood stained T-shirt and a pair of trousers belonging to Nahidul as well as the knives he used in the killing.

Deputy Commissioner (DC) of Detective Branch (south) Awlad Hossain told reporters yesterday that Nahidul said that he had a love affair with Poly in the past and had stabbed her to death to take revenge on her as she had broken off the year-long relationship recently and started release. going out with someone else.

DB sources said that Nahidul made contact with the victim over a cell phone before he went to Poly Rani Halder's residence on the night of February 15 when everyone

else in the house were out. After his arrival at the flat, Nahidul attacked Poly with knives he had bought on the way there, DCDB Awlad said. At one point, he also grabbed a boti -- a carved kitchen blade -from the kitchen and repeatedly attacked her with it till she was dead.


