

Handcuffed JMB man blasts grenade at press meet

Cops, journos among 13 hurt in the attack at Gazipur SP's office; 7 grenades, huge bomb-making materials, CDs, books on jihad seized; 7 militants held

A Jama'atul Mujahideen Bangladesh (JMB) man in handcuffs detonated a grenade at the police superintendent's office in Gazipur yesterday, injuring at least a dozen people, mostly police and journalists.

The blast took place at around 4:30pm as four JMB operatives, three of them women, were being paraded with seized grenades and explosives on display for the media.

Superintendent of Police in Gazipur Abdul Baten said Mamun alias Zahid, the male arrestee, dived

on the grenades kept on a table and managed to pull the pin out of one.

Earlier in the morning, police captured the four and recovered five grenades and a huge cache of bomb-making materials at a house in Tongi.

Besides Zahid, nine policemen and three journalists were injured in the freak incident.

The wounded cops include Officer-in-Charge (OC) of Joydevpur Police Station Abdur Rashid, OC Abdul Hanif of Detective Branch in Gazipur, sub-inspectors (SI) Omar

Trained female JMB militants appear on scene for first time

Noor Jahan, one of the females arrested at the JMB den at Ghotroil in Gazipur, took off the SIM of a cellphone and broke it to pieces with her teeth in the blink of an eye when police raided the place.

Sub-inspector (SI) of Tongi Police Station Sirajul Islam, who was present during the arrest, said, "I strongly believe Noor Jahan and the other two women arrestees are JMB members."

He came to the conclusion seeing the activities of the women. They acted like trained Jama'atul Mujahideen Bangladesh (JMB) members.

Sheer neglect let it happen

Law enforcers didn't defuse grenades even after 6 hrs of seizure

The violent attack by an arrested Jama'atul Mujahideen Bangladesh (JMB) cadre at a press briefing in Gazipur SP office yesterday could be made due to callousness of police.

Although recovery of explosives and holding of such press briefings became a routine over the last three years, yesterday's incident is an unprecedented one as an arrestee detonated a seized grenade.

Police and Rapid Action Battalion (Rab) officials admitted the incident occurred as the press briefing was arranged without defusing the five improvised grenades seized from a Gazipur village.

A Rab official mentioned that in the last three years, they arranged press briefings displaying seized bombs and grenades after those were defused.

Five of a Ctg family burnt to death

22 hurt in shopping mall fire in Dhaka; 25 shops gutted

Five members of a family were burnt alive in a fire at a house in Sitakunda upazila early yesterday.

The deceased were identified as Abul Bashar, 45, son of Md Abdullah Mia, Bashar's wife Selina Begum, 35, their three sons Shourav, 14, Sabuj, 10 and Sajib, 3.

Meanwhile, at least 20 garment workers and two firemen suffered injuries in a fire that gutted around 25 shops at a market on the Elephant Road in the capital.

Fire Service and police said the fire broke out at the tin-shed house of Bashar, a candle supplier, at Doajipara of Sitakunda upazila at around 1:20am.

Sources said the fire might have originated from an electrical

Hands Ekushey Padak to 13


