government after he challenged the forced retirement decision to the High Court. The then BNP government branded him as a loyalist of the Awami League (AL).

The present government made Ali Kabir, who was the chairman of Bangladesh Inland Water Transport Authority (BIWTA), acting establishment secretary after a week of assuming office.

Sources in the administration said Ali Kabir's transfer came amid an allegation that he along with a few senior officials was reshuffling the administration on political consideration, sidelining many who are allegedly leaning to BNP and Jamaat.

"He has made himself controversial for his role in promotion, postings and making officers OSD (officer on special duty) in the last one month," a senior official told The Daily Star.

The officer said the new establishment secretary is also known as a loyalist of the new government. So there is little chance that the new secretary would reverse the reshuffling policy, the official added.

Meanwhile, three additional secretary-level officers were also transferred yesterday.

Ataharul Islam, chairman of the National Identity Registration Authority, has been made acting secretary of the labour and employment ministry.

Acting secretary of the expatriate welfare and overseas employment ministry Sheikh Mukhlisur has been made the acting secretary of food and disaster management ministry while additional secretary of the industries ministry Ilias Ahmed appointed as acting secretary of the expatriate welfare and overseas employment ministry.

Barguna, Muslim Choudhury, 55, son of late Kalai Choudhury, and Shohag, 8.

The body of a boy aged between 12 and 15 could not be identified.

Relatives of the missing passengers are privately conducting search operations using trawlers, boats, fishing nets. The official search operations were called off Thursday evening, the very day the launch went down.

Locals and relatives of those who went missing recovered six of the nine bodies between 9:30am and 10:30am yesterday. Two others were recovered around 12:30pm and a BIWTA speedboat recovered one around 2:30pm. Locals and relatives recovered another body in the evening.

Hayatul Islam Khan, assistant commissioner of Barisal Metropolitan Police, told The Daily Star that two bodies went down stream. A speedboat of the Bangladesh Inland Water Transport Authority (BIWTA) was sent to recover them but it managed to recover one.

Locals, however, claimed that they saw at least four bodies going downstream.

A few hundred people are still waiting at the spot for missing people.

Locals and relatives of the victims recovered four bodies Saturday.

The salvage operation ended around 5:00pm Thursday. The rescue operations were called off at 7:00pm the same day with 27 bodies recovered.

However, 14 bodies were recovered afterwards including one that was trapped inside the engine room of the launch. Urchins discovered the body in the launch at the Barisal port/jetty Saturday.

The launch ML Fahmida Happy Express around 6:00am Thursday was hit by a cargo vessel in the stern. It sank near Beltola-Charabandi Kheyra Ghat in the Kirtankhola in Barisal seven to 10 minutes later.

## Hasina urges BNP to return to Sangsad

orientation programme for the members of ninth parliament, where visiting Indian Lok Sabha Speaker Somnath Chatterjee also spoke.

Somnath in his speech said it is imperative to have a strong opposition in the parliament to make it effective, adding that an understanding between the treasury and the opposition benches, and having mutual respect for each other is very important.

Hasina, also the leader of the parliament, urged her main opposition BNP to return to the House and uphold the dignity of the people's mandate by presenting to the parliament problems of the people, and their hopes and aspirations.

She said the people's representatives in the country could not work for public welfare uninterrupted as 'democracy was repeatedly hindered by martial laws or emergencies'.

"We didn't get to enjoy uninterrupted democracy. So our chance of experiencing the parliamentary procedure was also hindered," she said at the inauguration of the four-day programme in Hotel Sonargaon of the capital.

National Democratic Institute for International Affairs (NDI), a non-profit, non-governmental US organization for supporting democratic institutions and practices in the world, and the US Agency for International Development (USAID) organized the programme for providing senior MPs, experts, and international guests with a forum for sharing the best experiences of parliamentary practices.

About the repeated interruption in democracy, Hasina said at first martial laws were imposed, and then political parties are formed, and finally public representatives are selected in the name of an election.

During the immediate past caretaker rule, a move was on to float a "king's party" at public expense, but that was not successful because of the bold public and international support for democracy, she claimed.

Terming the new parliament significant, she urged lawmakers to make it effective rising above partisanship. "If you fail to perform your duties as lawmakers with your merits, skills, and honesty, the people will not vote for you the next time," she warned.

The prime minister urged the opposition to return to the parliament saying, "Come to the parliament. Let's uphold the dignity of the people's mandate. Your constructive criticisms will show the government the way to public welfare."

Referring to the feud between the majority and minority coalitions in the parliament over the seating arrangement in the House, Hasina said the speaker already initiated a move to resolve the problem, as the ruling coalition does not look at the opposition merely in terms of their number. She hoped that the opposition will return to the House after they are given one or two more seats in the forum.

An accountable parliament can fulfil public expectations, she added urging the lawmakers to think about how to ensure the well being of the people.

She advised the new MPs to study more, to take advice from their senior colleagues, to know the country's laws, parliamentary rules of procedures, and the code of conduct in order to be able to enact laws for the country's development.

Ministers, advisers to the prime minister, high government officials, and diplomats were present at the event, among others.

The prime minister also said it has become imperative to come out of the old pattern of thinking, and to build a political leadership capable of facing the challenges of the 21st century. "Broadmindedness, not vengeance, must be practiced as the new political philosophy," she noted.

Lok Sabha Speaker Somnath Chatterjee said the lawmakers should have sufficient knowledge to play their roles effectively in enacting laws in parliament.

He said since a lot of things

are discussed or debated in the House, every lawmaker should have enough knowledge about the issues to play his or her due role.

Whatever the lawmakers say in parliament has to be informative so that it can be of some help to the government, he said, adding that it is good to have heated argument in parliament but any pandemonium in the House is not desirable.

Somnath, also former president of Commonwealth Parliamentary Association (CPA), said it is hard to complete all discussions sitting in parliament for 200 days a year.

Underlining the importance of the opposition in parliamentary democracy, he said, "Opposition is one of the pillars in parliamentary democracy. The opposition can give important opinion and the government can also entertain those for the betterment of people."

He however said the opposition should not oppose everything for the sake of opposing only.

Somnath also said the lawmakers should be in close touch with people. "If you do not get close to them, listen to them, then how will you work for their welfare?"

He said the lawmakers should be respectful and friendly to each other and have the mentality to work together and listen to each other with patience.

The Lok Sabha speaker said whenever the parliamentary democracy suffers a blow, people grieve as democracy is the desire of the people who

establish it through election.

"Through the parliamentary democracy it is proved that people are the supreme authority," he said, adding that the accountability of the government is ensured through parliament.

Urging the lawmakers to show due respect to the speaker, Somnath said it is the responsibility and duty of the lawmakers to obey the speaker.

He expressed his gratitude to the people of Bangladesh for establishing democracy and urged all to work effectively to take it forward.

Somnath hoped that India and Bangladesh having similar culture and heritage can work together not only for strengthening democracy, but also for their development.

Referring to the formation of different parliamentary forums including the ones on issues related to women and climate change in Lok Sabha, he said the forums helped the lawmakers acquire knowledge on important issues that are not discussed often.

Somnath mentioned about the Indian Lok Sabha TV channel that covers parliamentary activities without any interference from government and suggested that Bangladesh should also have such a TV channel.

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina said they would consider about such a TV channel and hoped that the Jatiya Sangsad speaker will take necessary steps in this regard.

Speaker Abdul Hamid also spoke at the programme as the special guest.

## Fund crunch hits GTCL

cubic feet of gas a day against a demand of 2,018 million cubic feet of gas a day this year. But the reality is different.

The 1,800 million cubic feet of gas a day is not being supplied at optimal pressure. The need for the compressors has become very urgent as low gas pressure and lack of gas is already causing 550 megawatt (MW) to 700 MW power generation shortfall. Ghorashal and Palash Urea Fertiliser factories have suspended production due to low gas pressure.

Without the compressors, new pipelines will fail to deliver gas at proper pressure, jeopardising all upcoming power projects, sources said.

In Titas gas supply area, nearly 100 large industrial consumers, who have already invested crores of taka, are without gas supply.

"New industrial growth and private investment will be badly affected and discouraged. The major foreign exchange earning sectors like readymade garments will be affected. Even, the future import of gas from neighbouring countries may be affected," said a Petrobangla source.

Due to non-availability and low pressure of gas, the supply situation will worsen in June-July when new power projects with the total capacity of 700 MW will be added to the national grid. This will not help improve the load shedding scenario.

This summer power cuts will increase between 1,000 MW and 2,000 MW a day.

"While installing the compressors will not immediately help the gas supply system, we should not plan on anything without them because nothing will work," said an official.

The three compressor stations will increase gas pressure and supplies to the old power plants, plus ensure quality gas supply to future power projects like the 450 MW and 150 MW Sirajganj schemes or the new Haripur 360 MW, Siddhirganj 300 MW, Chandpur 150 MW schemes in Titas area and the south-western and northern regions of the country.

"Without the compressors, the three new GTCL pipeline projects will not be able to transmit gas with adequate pressure to run any power plant or heavy industries. In other words, the pipeline projects themselves will not be meaningful," said a Petrobangla official.

"Gas is supplied at 1,000 psi (pounds per square inch) from the gas fields to the national pipeline grid. But as gas flows a great distance, the pressure falls. For instance, the gas

pressure drops to 600 psi at Ashuganj," said the official.

Such drops are causing Raazan power plants to produce only 160 MW of power though these can generate 360 MW. Last week, the Tongi 80 MW power plant tripped due to low gas pressure. Even domestic gas supplies in Mirpur area of the capital are being affected.

**PROJECT DETAIL**  
An ADB loan of \$235 million was offered to the government in 2006. Of this fund, \$189 million was given to the GTCL for the compressors and three pipelines while the rest was marked as clean fuel project and Petrobangla's manpower training.

Keeping around \$14 million as contingency budget for the \$189 million fund, the GTCL held separate tenders for the pipeline and compressor projects.

The three pipeline projects are: Monohardi-Elena 30 inch 51 km pipeline to transmit gas to Sirajganj and up to Khulna; Jamuna West-Nalka-Bheramara 30 inch 98 km, and Bheramara to Khulna 20 inch 162 km. The tenders for the two latter projects are now in advance stage while the first one--the Monohardi-Elena pipeline--is in the primary stage.

The Monohardi project is a supply reinforcement scheme as there is already another pipeline.

The GTCL floated the first tender for the compressors in April, 2006, in which three companies participated. It was then alleged that some GTCL officials in connivance with bidder Punj Lloyd and compressor vendor Solar were manipulating the tender. The ADB investigated the allegation and permanently blacklisted Solar from the project and other ADB-funded projects in the world for two years.

AGCL official was also fired. The second tender was held in January 23, 2008, and closed on June last year in which four companies participated. ABB and Hyundai qualified technically and their financial offers were opened earlier this month. Compressor stations will be installed in Muchai, Ashuganj and Elena.

**FINANCING ALTERNATIVES**  
The GTCL, Petrobangla and the energy ministry had been holding meetings for the last two weeks to figure out how to finance the project. The government already proposed to the ADB to increase the loan. The ADB refused and suggested that the government seek a new loan.

As a new loan is a time

consuming process, a Petrobangla director suggested that one of the compressors be installed by oil company Chevron at a higher cost under production sharing contract (PSC) with the Bibiyana Gas Field.

Chevron has already submitted a proposal to install a compressor station using devices from Solar at the cost of \$52 million at Muchai; whereas Hyundai's proposal for a station there costs only \$40 million. The director suggests that another compressor be dropped from the scheme for now and Hyundai be asked to install just one compressor.

An official said, "In addition to being a costly solution, the question is why we should involve Chevron in it? Chevron's cost in Bibiyana Gas Field has been recovered under the PSC and Petrobangla is now enjoying 78 percent share as free gas from Bibiyana's production of 500 million cubic feet of gas a day. Once we let Chevron add this compressor station, Chevron will recover its cost on priority basis. Its share will increase. We are giving our own money--\$12 million extra--to Chevron. This is not a good option at all."

There are other solutions. The GTCL believes that the \$38 million tender for Monohardi-Elena pipeline project may be suspended for now as its financial offer has not been opened. As this is a supply reinforcement project, it can be delayed by a year before new financing is available.

If this \$38 million is diverted and added to the existing \$55 million, the GTCL instantly gets \$96 million ready. Plus, the GTCL also has \$14 million as contingency fund, making the total \$110 million available for the job.

"If the government exempts 8.5 percent tax from Hyundai's offer, the Hyundai proposal slides down to \$136.7 million. The remaining money can easily be arranged by bridge financing from the government's Annual Development Project (ADP) allocation for the energy sector," said an official.

The government has allocated to the energy sector Tk 784 crore under the ADP this fiscal year. Of this, only 20 percent has been utilised, the rest of this huge fund is now available for better use, the official argued.

"If the government is going to cancel this tender, a re-tender will take a lot of time and the price offers are likely to go up," the official added.
