Seven killed in road accidents

Seven people were killed and 35 others injured in separate road accidents in Comilla and Gaibandha yesterday.

A correspondent in Comilla reports: Five people were killed and 35 others injured in a road accident on Dhaka-Chittagong highway at Nalgor at Chouddagram early yesterday.

Vehicular movement on Dhaka-Chittagong highway was suspended for one and

half hours due to the accident. The dead were identified as Upen Chandra Das, 45, and his son Noni Gopal Das, 8, Dina Rani Ray, 38, Litu Khandaker,

The accident took place when a passenger bus collided head-on with a covered van. The injured were admitted

22, and Kanai Biswas, 55.

to Chouddagram Health Complex and Comilla Medical College Hospital.

Of them, condition of an unidentified person was stated to be critical.

Our correspondent in Gaibandha adds: A motorcyclist and his wife were killed in a road accident on Rangpur-Bogra highway at Kalitola yesterday.

Police said Sohrab Ali, 38, and his wife Hosne Ara, 30, were going to Shibganj in Bogra when a speeding bus hit the motorcycle from the opposite direction.

Sohrab died on the spot while Hosne Ara succumbed to her injuries on the way to Rangpur Medical College Hospital.

CTG ARMS CASE Two prime accused on remand again STAFF CORRESPONDENT,

Chittagong

A Chittagong court yesterday placed two prime accused, Hafizur Rahman and Din Mohammad, in a four-day remand again in the sensational Chittagong Arms Case.

Chittagong Metropolitan Judicial Magistrate Osman Gani granted the remand after a hearing.

On Tuesday, Investigation Officer (IO) of the case Md Moniruzzaman, an assistant superintendent of police of Criminal Investigation Department (CID), in a prayer sought four-day remand for the two prime accused in the 10 truckloads of arms smuggling case, court sources said.

Hafizur and Din were earlier taken on five-day remand that ended on Monday, they said.

In the country's largestever arms haul, the joint forces seized 10 truckloads of 10,000 arms, including submachineguns, AK 47 rifles, rocket propelled grenades and their launchers, 2,000 grenades and three lakh bullets in the early hours on April 2, 2004 from Chittagong Urea Fertiliser Ltd (CUFL) jetty.

After the arms haul, two separate cases were filed, one under section-25/B of the Special Power Act for arms smuggling and the other under section-19 (ka) of the Arms Act with the Karnaphuli Police Station.

Of the 43 accused in both the cases, only Hafizur and Din are now in jail while 33 others are on bail and eight others absconding.

BNP leader stabbed to death in Shariatpur

A local BNP leader was stabbed to death by the criminals at Dhipur in Gosairhat upazila yesterday.

The dead was identified as M Khalilur Rahman Peyada, president of Idilpur union unit BNP and 4 No UP member.

Local sources said the miscreants hacked Khalil, cut tendons of his legs and broke his hands in the afternoon and then left him in a paddy field.

Villagers rescued him in a critical condition and rushed him to Gosairhat Hospital where doctors declared him dead.
