Indian report fears

AFP, New Delhi

India has said neighbouring Pakistan could become a "failed state", with doubts emerging about who is in control of the country, a report said yesterday.

The government also warned no part of the world would be safe from what Foreign Minister Pranab Mukherjee called the "flames being ignited there," the Press Trust of India (PTI) news agency reported.

The government's assessment came from Home Minister Palaniappan Chidambaram and Mukherjee at two separate events on Friday.

"It (Pakistan) is not a failed state, but it's threatening to become one," Chidambaram told a seminar in India's financial hub Mumbai.

1 killed, 40 hurt in RMG factory clash

At least one person was killed and 40 others were injured, five of them critically, in a series of clashes between the workers of a sweater factory and outsiders in Gilarchala area of Sreepur upazila yesterday.

The deceased was identified as Saiful Islam, 28, a shop owner of the area.

Sources said the terminated workers of Pandora Sweaters went to the factory gate around 9:00am demanding their arrears and reinstatement in jobs. At one stage, local musclemen hired allegedly by the factory owners attacked them, ensuing the

The clash spread inside and outside the factory as a group of local people and the workers inside the factory joined hands with the terminated workers, sources said.

Saiful who was beaten by agitating workers during the clash was taken to Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH) where he succumbed to his injuries at about 2.15pm.

Meanwhile, angry workers put up barricade on Dhaka-Mymensingh highway beside the factory around 10:00am, disrupting traffic movement on the route.


