Key changes in top command of army

Some key changes have been brought to the top command of Bangladesh Army, according to highly placed sources.

They said the government has decided to appoint Commandant of the Military Command & Staff College Maj Gen Iqbal Karim Bhuiyan the GOC of the Nine Infantry Division of Savar area com-

Bhuiyan will replace incumbent GOC Maj Gen Md Asab Uddin who was appointed the Commandant of Military Command & Staff College.

Meanwhile, the government has also sent two generals into forced retirement.

The two generals are Commandant of the National Defence College Lt Gen Md Aminul Karim and Director General of Bangladesh Institute of International Strategic Studies (BIISS) Maj Gen Fatemi Ahmed Rumi.

Lt Gen Aminul Karim was the military secretary to the president during the 1/11 and later promoted to Lieutenant General and Maj Gen Rumi was the director general of Special Security Force (SSF) during the previous BNP-led four-party alliance.

The reasons behind the forced retirement could not be known, but the sources said the decision was taken as per the service rule of the Armed Forces.


Earlier, the government brought several changes to the Brigadier General positions.

With a move to overcome the funding crunch, the government is now advancing with a new financing formula under which donor agencies would initially finance the planned projects which would then be transferred to private sector.

But it is not clear whether the new funding mechanism should click, sources added.

The Awami League-led grand-alliance government laid out a plan in its election manifesto that one of its main thrusts would be on improvement of the country's power sector which remains fragile mainly through reported haggling overwork orders for long in the past.

The ruling coalition promised to increase the power generation to 7,000 megawatts (MW) within the next five years from the existing production level of 3,500 MW to meet an evergrowing demand.

Experts said it would require at least \$2.75 to \$3.25 billion only in generation segment to enhance the electricity production.


