# Dalits lack access to housing

Seminar told

Although housing is one of the basic rights, members of the Dalit community find it extremely difficult to rent a house because of the prevailing social discriminations against them, speakers at a seminar said yesterday.

House owners refuse to rent out rooms to Dalits, once they come to know about their identity, Mazharul Islam, a researcher, said while presenting the keynote paper.

A Bangladeshi worker was killed as a pile of earth collapsed on him while he was working in a construction ditch at Makkah in Saudi Arabia on Wednesday.

The identity of the worker could not be known.

Local Civil Defence spokesman Lt Col Ali Al-Muntashiri said the worker was in a fivemetre-deep ditch and attempts to dig him out in time were unsuccessful, according to the Arab News, a Saudi English newspaper.

Later, the body was sent to a nearby hospital.

The spokesman denied any foul play or criminal suspicion in the death of the worker, but said the police summoned the contractor responsible for the digging to check if there were any violations involved.

#### JCD demands congenial atmosphere at DU

Leaders and activists of Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD) demonstrated on Dhaka University (DU) campus on Thursday demanding peaceful coexistence at the university halls.

To press home their demands, several hundred JCD men brought out a protest procession from Madhu's Canteen at around 12:30pm that paraded different streets on the campus and ended in front of the vice chancellor's office.

The JCD men then staged a two-hour sit-in at the entrance of the VC's office. Leaders from the sit-in urged the DU authorities to take immediate steps to allocate rooms at the halls for JCD activists who are out of the campus since the Awami League-led grand alliance formed the government.

JCD DU unitsGeperal Secretary Saiful Islam told The Daily Star that they would declare a one-day student-strike on March 29 if their demands go unheeded.

They also demanded security to the JCD leaders and activists on the campus and punishment to Bangladesh Chhatra League cadres who had beaten up JCD men on the campus following the ninth parliamentary elections.

JCD men who had enjoyed supreme control at DU during the regime of the last BNP-Jamaat alliance government left the dormitories on the polling night of the ninth parliamentary elections.
