#### Ronaldo wants to score 30 goals

Brazil's Ronaldo, who returned to competition with Corinthians earlier this month after a year's absence, said on Sunday he wanted to score 30 goals this season.

The 1994 and 2002 World Cup winner, and two-time European footballer of the year, tore his left knee tendon while playing for AC Milan in February last year.

"I would like to play a match a week, or about 30 matches, and scoring about 30 goals would be good. It's a figure I like. It's a good aim, and includes the two goals I have already scored," Ronaldo told local media.

Ronaldo started his spell at Corinthians on March 4 after coming on midway through the second half of a 2-0 Brazilian Cup victory over Itumbiara.

#### Eto'o, Zlatan boost value

Samuel Eto'o and Zlatan Ibrahimovic took their combined goals tally to 42 on Sunday to spectacularly boost their sale value if Barcelona and Inter Milan decide to cash in their prize assets in the summer.

Cameroon international Eto'o scored twice as Barcelona crushed Malaga 6-0 to restore their six-point lead in Spain to take his league goals to 25.

Swedish striker Ibrahimovic also grabbed a brace, to take his personal goals collection to 17, as Inter Milan went seven points clear in Italy with a 3-0 win at the San Siro against rock-bottom Reggina.

Reports in Spain have linked Eto'o with a move to AC Milan, but Barcelona coach Pep Guardiola insists the striker has yet to make up his mind.

"The press have given the impression that Eto'o is already out of Barcelona," said Guardiola. "He doesn't deserve this. He will decide his future when the time is right for him."

After striking his two goals on Sunday, the 28-year-old Eto'o, who has been at Barcelona since 2004, preferred to concentrate on this season, rather than next.

It is one more game gone, said Eto'o. "I always have a chance of scoring in this team. We just want to push on now and carry on with this form

after the international break. After his star performance, Ibrahimovic, who signed for Inter from Juventus in 2006, hinted that he may be considering a future away from the

San Siro. "I'm totally focussed on winning the title but as for next season, we'll see," he said. "I'm very happy to be at

Inter but next year we'll see." Mourinho reacted by sug-

gesting that Inter would survive without the 27-year-old Swede. "Ibrahimovic is a great

player but no player is bigger than a club. He has become very important to Inter but certain clubs are bigger than any player or coach," said Mourinho.

## Barca demolish Malaga

Barcelona have plundered 84 goals this season at an average of three goals a game and are well on course to reach a century before the end of the season.

Cameroon attacker Eto'o leads the way with 25 goals while Messi has 19 for the season and Henry a creditable 15. The trio were on the score-

sheet against Malaga but Brazilian Alves had the honour of scoring the goal of the game heading in after a sublime pass from Andres Iniesta had carved the visitors open. Dutch striker Klaas-Jan

Huntelaar made it eight goals in his last six games with a brace as Real Madrid eased to a 3-0 win over Almeria.

Legendary Real old boy Hugo Sanchez, now coach at Almeria, grabbed the prematch attention on his return to the Santiago Bernabeu, but it was Huntelaar who stole the headlines with a clinical second-half double.

Brazilian Marcelo, jeered by his own fans this season, silenced the doubters with a 23rd minute opener before Huntelaar showed his predatory instincts in the 52nd and 65th minutes to wrap up the points.

Real struck first on 23 minutes with Marcelo driving home from outside the area with his weaker right foot.

Marcelo hit the crossbar early in the second period before Huntelaar rifled a volley into the roof of the net. The Dutch forward added a second with a neat finish after Almeria failed to clear their lines.

Elsewhere, Atletico Madrid's Champions League hopes suffered a blow as they fell to a 2-0 defeat at Real Mallorca.

Atletico stay five points behind fourth-placed Villarreal with Valencia now level on points following their 1-0 victory over Racing Santander.

It was a big win for Mallorca who surge up to 12th although they are only three points above the drop.

There are a staggering 11 teams still involved in the relegation battle with tenthplaced Racing only four points better off than third from bottom Osasuna.

Osasuna secured a 1-0 win over troubled Espanyol scoring in the dying seconds to snatch the spoils.

Espanyol, one of the few teams to beat Barcelona this season, are adrift at the bottom eight points from safety.

Zlatan Ibrahimovic starred as Inter Milan cruised to a 3-0 victory over rock-bottom Reggina at the San Siro to re-establish their seven-point lead at the top of Serie A on Sunday.

Second-placed Juventus had briefly reduced the arrears on Saturday with a highlyimpressive 4-1 romp at Roma, but Jose Mourinho's men showed they were in no mood to concede any

ground in the title race. Meanwhile third-placed AC Milan were held to a 0-0 draw at Napoli, who have not won in 11 matches.

Two goals in the first 10 minutes effectively turned the topversus-bottom clash into a non-contest, despite Inter playing with midfielder Esteban Cambiasso in a patchwork centre-back pairing due to injuries.

With only nine matches left, the chances of Juve catching Inter are diminishing and may even rest on the pair's clash in

Turin next month. But Mourinho is still thinking about how to improve his side

for a tilt at European glory rather than mere domestic success. "To make Inter more competitive, even in Europe, we need some retouching. We have two or three young players with great potential who in two or three years will be great players," he said. Inter got off to a fine start as Mario Balotelli played the ball into the area and a clever between-the-legs flick from Dejan Stankovic released Cambiasso to delicately chip over Christian Puggioni on six minutes.

Just four minutes later Ibrahimovic doubled the hosts' advantage from the penalty spot after a contentious penalty award.

Brazilian winger Mancini went down under a challenge from Carlos Valdez but the referee, whose view was blocked by two players, pointed to the spot. Inter threatened to run away with things as Ibrahimovic had

two clear chances around the quarter-hour mark but he scuffed a shot from eight yards well wide from Balotelli's pass and then took a ball from Davide Santon only to smack his shot onto a post. Reggina had one gilt-edged chance towards the end of the first half after Inter's Colombian centre-back Nelson Rivas had

been drawn out of position.

Andrea Costa slipped in Antonino Barilla but he shot straight at Brazilian goalkeeper Julio Cesar.

Just before the hour, Ibrahimovic showed why he is thought of so highly in Italy.

He picked up the ball 30 yards from goal, burst past three defenders and at the edge of the box hit an exquisite chip over Puggioni and into the top corner. Reggina had one last chance late on to salvage something

from the match but Julio Cesar pulled off a fine save to deny Alessio Sestu. In the race for fourth place, and the final Champions League

Primera Liga, 26 points behind leaders Barcelona.


### France lose Anelka
