> "Jamaat-e-Islami cherishes Pakistan and Islam as an inseparable entity," commented former Jamaat ameer Golam Azam in 1971. He was also the chief of the East Pakistan unit of Jamaat during the Liberation War.

Jamaat's mouthpiece the daily Sangram covered a speech by Golam Azam in 1971. "Pakistan is the house of Islam for the world Muslims. Therefore, Jamaat activists don't justify being alive had Pakistan disintegrated," Golam Azam was quoted by Sangram as of Al-Badr. addressing a reception of Jamaat ministers at

Another Bangladesh Rifles (BDR) member allegedly committed suicide at 38 Akhalia Battalion Headquarters in Sylhet yesterday was identified as Sepoy

10,000 programmers a year; IT curriculum must in SSC level by 2013, in primary 2021; opens digital expo

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday said her government will do whatever necessary to create 10,000 information technology (IT) programmers every

The government will introduce compulsory IT curriculum at secondary school level by 2013 and primary level by 2021, Hasina said at the inaugural ceremony of BCS Digital

Friendship Conference Centre. Earlier, she had been informed at the Expo that the country's educational institutions produce only 2,500 programmers every year.

The premier said Bangladesh's major prob-



lem is illiteracy, not population.

"If we can educate a portion of the population in information and communication technology (ICT), they can get employment at home and abroad," she said.

Hasina said the present government is keen to introduce e-governance and now planning to make all its procurement through 'e-tender' to check corrup-

The ICT stakeholders placed a list of demands before Hasina. Her party Awami League had made an election pledge to have a 'Digital Bangladesh' by 2021.
