3 killed in boiler blast

At least 3 workers, including two women, were killed and 10 others injured in a boiler explosion at a rice mill in Burichang upazila early morning yesterday.

The deceased were Shohel Miah, 35, of Sylhet district, Monowara Begum, 45, of Debidwer upazila and Alaban Bibi, 40, of Mymensingh. Sohel and Alaban Bibi died on way to the hospital.

Police and fire fighters said around 3:15am the boiler of Nishad Rice Mill exploded scattering over a 250-yardarea damaging the tin-shade

The European Union Election Observer Mission (EU EOM) has rejected allegations of armed forces' influence in the ninth parliamentary election, or of any mechanism or intimidation from any quarter to manipulate polling.

The EU EOM in its final report on the election released yesterday said the poll was held in a free and fair manner, and there was no rigging in it.

The EU mission also brushed aside allegations of different political parties that the Election Commission (EC) was biased, and it did not act neutrally in holding the election.

"I heard the so called rumours of certain mechanism. We invited those who had raised the rumours to come forward with evidence, and our mission was here (in Bangladesh) till January 16. We were here more than two weeks after the election," said Alexander Graff Lambsdorff, chief of the EU EOM, while releasing the report at a press conference at a city hotel.

"I saw that the security forces created an environment that generally speaking did nothing to intimidate the voters around and inside the poling stations. I could not see any intimidation SEE PAGE 15 COL 1

Arms, ammo still all around Pilkhana 6 BDR men offer confessional

Bangladesh Rifles (BDR) headquarters at Pilkhana is still an unsafe zone as grenades and other explosives remained scattered here and there even after a month of the mutiny by border guards.

"Arms, ammunition and other explosives, including grenades, are still being recovered everyday as BDR members hid those at various places, even in socks and dresses," BDR Director General (DG) Brig Gen Md Mainul Islam told reporters yesterday.

Addressing a press briefing at the conference hall of BDR headquarters, the DG said it is quite impossible to say exactly how many explosives and ammunition were used during the mutiny and how many arms and explosives taken away by the mutineers. At the end of the counting, it would be possible to

assess how many arms went missing, he said. Meanwhile, six BDR mutiny suspects yesterday gave confessional statements before the court about their involvement in

the carnage for the first time after the incident.
