

# Hazari sued for looting, vandalism

UNB, Feni

Two cases were filed against 20 people, including former Awami League lawmaker and alleged godfather of the district Jomal Hazari on charges of attack, looting, vandalism and mugging.

Abdul Mannan, private car driver of Jubo League leader Nizam Hazari, and Chhatra League leader Ziaul Alam Mister filed separate cases with Feni model police station at 9:30 pm on Monday.

Jomal Hazari's cousin Mosharraf Hossain Hazari Miah, nephew Faruq Hazari, commissioner Titu Hazari, Bitu Hazari, Pitu Hazari and Shajahan Saju were among the accused.

According to the statement of complainant Ziaul Alam Mister, Jomal Hazari had directed Chhatra League leader Mister to contact him regularly after he got bail from the High Court (HC).

As Mister ignored his direction, Jomal Hazari became angry. On Sunday night some armed miscreants, led by Jomal Hazari attacked Mister at his Purbo Ukilpara residence in the district town.

They beat up Mister, fired blank shots to create panic and looted cash, gold ornaments and other valuables of the house after beating up the inmates, the complainant said.

Complainant of another case Abdul Mannan

alleged that when he was going to keep the car at the house of Nizam Hazari at Purbo Ukilpara some armed goons beat him and took away the car.

Meanwhile, witnesses and other victims said that the associates of Jomal Hazari beat up Feni Sadar upazila BCL president Anwar Hossain Manik and former BCL leader Mohammad Hanif when, hearing of the attack, they went to the house of Mister along with Nizam Hazari on Sunday night.

Later, police rescued injured Manik and Hanif from Masterpara area of the town. Both were given treatment in a private clinic.

Jomal Hazari, who went into hiding before the parliamentary polls in 2001, appeared before the HC on February 22 this year for bails in the cases filed earlier against him.

Hazari, tried in absentia, was awarded a total 60 years' imprisonment in five out of 19 cases.

A HC division bench on February 22 directed Hazari, wanted in 19 criminal cases, to surrender before the trial courts within eight weeks in connection with 11 criminal cases.

The HC bench, however, asked the law enforcement agencies not to harass or arrest Hazari in the eleven cases within the eight weeks and also granted him ad-interim bail for two months in a carjacking case.

# Tk 155cr scheme

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Earlier in 2001, the government okayed an act titled Bangladesh Disability Welfare Act. Experts, however, argued that the act is sketchy and also does not give any specific directions about utilising people with disabilities as a positive human resource power.

An amendment to the act, to address its shortcomings, was to be approved in December 2007 but has not been done till date. There are also no moves at the national level to develop this vast human resource of the country with proper training.

As the nation observes National Disability Day today, many disabled people express their fears and uncertainty about their future in a country, which largely ignores their plight.

Nazia is one such person.

A masters student of Mass Communication and Journalism at Dhaka University (DU), Nazia is not sure whether she will be able to secure a job after she graduates, given that she is visually impaired.

She already had to face many hurdles to come this far in life. Statistics show that only one in 100 persons with a disability in our country get a chance for higher education.

"Those of us with disabilities somehow cope through life. But I am still uncertain about my own future. Unlike normal students, I don't know if I can secure a job even after acquiring a post-graduate degree," Nazia said.

Nazia is one of 41 students at DU who suffer from visual impairment. Another 20 are physically challenged.

Mujibur Rahman, DU's welfare officer for the disabled, told The Daily Star most students with disabilities who have graduated from DU remain unemployed. He cites himself as an example of a person who is visually

impaired and has no problems carrying out a proper job.

"The situation could be improved if the government took initiatives to recruit these unemployed people to the vacant posts in schools for the visually impaired across the country," he suggested.

Non-Government Organisations (NGOs) working with PWDs say that the government does not seem concerned enough about rehabilitating the disabled.

Those intellectually challenged can be converted to skilled human resources if their problems are identified and they are trained accordingly. Disabilities can be categorised into four main levels: mild, moderate, severe and profound. People with mild to moderate types of intellectual disability can easily be trained to a certain level to do specified jobs, experts point out.

Society for the Welfare of the Intellectually Disabled (SWID), Bangladesh President Sajeda Humayun Kabir told The Daily Star, "The focus must be on identifying the level of one's disability and train them, in order to bring them out to the mainstream."

Suman, 26, suffers from severe intellectual disability. He works at Reneta Ltd, a pharmaceuticals company, sticking labels on products. He went to a SWID school and was given proper training to enable him to earn his own living, and he is doing fine now.

Around 20 students from SWID schools are at present working at different organisations and are self-reliant. Many have been working for the past seven to eight years and are doing well.

The figure is negligible considering that the school has 7500 students across the country.

Still this demonstrates the possibilities of proper rehabilitation.

its charter about operating madrasa and orphanage," says an official quoting the investigation report.

Citing the probe report, the official adds Green Crescent's sphere of work was supposed to be limited in Doulatkhan municipality as per its registration. But it had set up the madrasa-cum-orphanage in Borhanuddin upazila.

"Green Crescent not only illegally set up such an institution but also stretched its activities to Borhanuddin upazila without permission of the Department of Social Service," says an official asking not to be identified.

Fasial Mostafa's father Suman Mostafa who lives in Manchester in the UK told The Daily Star earlier Green Crescent has two bank accounts with the Doulatkhan branch of Sonali Bank.

But a social service department official says Green Crescent had mentioned its bank account with the Doulatkhan branch of Uttara Bank (account no 6267).

The sources say following busting of the suspected militants' den, the Bhola district office of the Department of Social Service submitted the probe report to its head office in Dhaka on March 26.

The Rab on March 24 seized a huge cache of firearms and ammo, explosives substance, four pairs of German uniforms, and booklets on jihad, Moulana Moududi and al-Qaeda founder Osama bin Laden.

The next day a special law and order meeting held at the Deputy Commissioner's Office, Bhola decided to run spot investigations into activities of all non-government orphanages, mosques, madrasas and lillah boardings in the district.

The meeting also formed a committee comprising officials from the district administration, police, Ansar, Village Defence Party and Department of Social Service to that end.

The sources say when Green Crescent was registered in Doulatkhan it had submitted the list of a nine-member executive committee of the organisation.

According to the social service department documents, the committee members are President Abul Kalam, Vice-president Bangladesh expatriate in the UK Faisal Mostafa, General Secretary Hasan Saifuddin Badal, Assistant Secretary Yunus Sharif, Treasurer Mizanur Rahman, Office Secretary Humayun Ahmed and members Sayem Uddin, Harunur Rashid and Zobayer Hossain.

"Though Green Crescent was supposed to inform the authorities about any changes in its executive committee, it did not do so after 2005. And recently we found some new names in the committee from the media reports," says an official.

The sources say Green Crescent authorities did not mention that they have registered an organisation in the UK by the same name.

"During registration they just mentioned that their vice-president lives in the UK," says an official in Bhola.

Another official in the capital says Green Crescent was registered with the aim to eradicate illiteracy, provide health service, social development and economic self-reliance for the poor in Doulatkhan.

But the Bhola official says medical services, relief distribution, children's parade and physical exercise on national days and feeding the poor sacrificing a dozen cows during Eid-ul-Adha were visible activities of the organisation in Doulatkhan.

The official adds Green Crescent neither informed offices of the social service department in Doulatkhan and Borhanuddin upazilas nor the executive officers of the upazilas about their new programmes in Borhanuddin including setting up a madrasa and mosque.

Sources say the social service department has sent the probe report to the Ministry of Social Welfare for further decisions and actions.

An official of the department says Green Crescent committed two major offences -- it expanded its programmes in Borhanuddin without government permission and kept illegal arms, ammunition and explosives in its possession.

"For these offences the government may cancel Green Crescent's registration in Bangladesh," the official observes.

# PM pledges to beef up police

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She praised the police department for its hard labour in maintaining law and order. "You have to work round the clock. You do not have any specific working hours. Even, sometimes, many policemen have to pass a day without any meals for the sake of duty."

However, the PM noted that there is no scope for getting complacent. "You need to be more active and industrious to keep people's life and property well-protected," she said.

Hasina observed that an uninterrupted flow of democracy, social stability and good governance are the three key ingredients for development of a country.

And "each of these elements can be achieved if police can work effectively."

She further noted that if a country remains unstable due

to problems like militancy and terrorism, investment would not come, which will also reduce employment opportunities.

"Eradicating militancy and terrorism is indispensable to attract investment from home and abroad. Police can play a significant role by maintaining law and order and social stability."

Apart from disclosing the government's plans to modernize the police department, the premier also cautioned the police members of stern action if anyone is found involved in any illegal act like taking bribe and extortion and harassing people.

"Work in such a way so that the people can trust and respect you. Remove police fear from the people and be their friend," she said.

Hasina hoped that not a

single person would be harassed by the policemen and asked the law enforcers to be careful about violation of human rights in all cases.

She asked police members to work keeping themselves above all political influence. "Not political loyalty but merit, skill and professional quality will be our scale of evaluation."

The PM strongly condemned the killings of army officers and civilians inside the Pikhana BDR headquarters on February 25-26 and recent bomb attack on a mosque in Pakistan.

"How a Muslim can kill another Muslim in such a way?" she wondered.

Sheikh Hasina called upon the police officers to remain cautious about bigotry in the name of the religion of peace, that is, Islam.

The official said the central bank cannot impose on the commercial banks the demands of these industries for benefits including loan at low interest. He, however, said they would continuously persuade the commercial banks about the matter but it cannot be given under a package deal.

On tax related facilities demanded by the affected industries, an official of the National Board of Revenue said chances are slim that the export-oriented industries, which already enjoy different tax related facilities, will be given fresh offers.

On the demand for cash

incentives, the finance minister has already said they have very limited scope for this. A source at the ministry said the government has already released Tk 888 crore in the current fiscal year's budget.

As of February 2009, Tk 243 crore has fallen overdue. Under the recession package the finance minister approved the overdue amount and it will be released soon.


Finance ministry sources said maybe no additional incentives will be given in the current fiscal year.

Sources said several departments of the finance ministry and other ministries concerned are examining the exporters'

demands. They may finalise by next week what benefits to give them.

The commerce minister yesterday told a delegation of Bangladesh Garment Manufacturers and Exporters Association (BGMEA) that they will be informed about the benefits they will be given within a day or two.

However, the finance ministry sources said according to their analysis the impact of the world recession was not much in the country's export-oriented industries. That is why they are considering loan rescheduling as a major benefit in the benefit package to be announced.

# Fire safety

Director General (DG) of Fire Service and Civil Defence Directorate Brig Gen Abu Nayeem Md Shahidullah said such actions against non-compliance are underway.

Pointing out various inadequacies in his directorate the DG said there are only 50 fire inspectors in the country and 15 of them are in the capital where there are only 13 fire stations with 11 set up before the independence.

"The allocation we have for public awareness campaigns is Tk 1 to 1.5 lakh a year," said Nayeem.

He said out of 9,310 fire incidents in 2008, 39 percent occurred due to electric short-circuits, 23 percent due to open burners (including gas), nine percent caused by cigarettes, five percent by mosquito coils, wild lamps and candles and 2.5 percent fires were caused by children playing with fire.

Kazi Golam Nasir, deputy chief architect of the public works ministry's architecture department, said all the relevant laws have to be integrated with Building Construction Act, 1952. He demanded that fire-safety rules be put under Fire Prevention and Dousing Act after consultation with professionals.

"An integrated set of rules is crucial to address the fire-safety situation," said Nasir.

The BNBC is legally binding for building construction, said Zoinal Abedin, member (planning) of Rajdhani Unnayan Karttripakkha (Rajuk). It contains detailed provisions on fire-safety measures in a building, the member added.

Architect Khandaker Tazuddin emphasised the need for builders' complying with the electrical code incorporated in the BNBC to prevent short-circuit fires.

IAB President Mubasshar Hussain said the underground Titas Gas supply network is maintained in such a manner that a pipe explosion, caused by an earthquake, could claim thousands of lives.

Life, property and neighbourhood hazards should be the foremost concerns in a building design, said architect Prof Nizamuddin Ahmed.

Use of electric multi-plugs is one of the prime causes of fire, according to fire-fighting system engineer Manash Kumar Mitra.

Fire-fighting systems in existing buildings should be rectified, said Tanvirul Huq Probal, president of Real Estate and Housing Association of Bangladesh

(Rehab).

To this day, reasons behind most of the fire incidents remain unearthed, said KM Mohammad Foyez Ullah, an architect of Bashundhara City Complex.

Urban planners and authorities concerned must retain ponds and lakes for water sources in the capital, said former president of Rehab AbdulAwal.


The Daily Star Editor Mahfuz Anam, who moderated the discussion, called upon the fire service authorities to be more up and doing to enforce relevant laws and ensure fire-safety standards.

Architects KM Mustapha Khalid, Zakiul Islam and Fire Service Deputy Director Sheikh Md Mizanur Rahman spoke among others.

Environmentalist Prof Abdullah Abu Sayeed and The Daily Star Managing Editor Syed Fahim Munaim were also present.

**Experts' recommendations:**

- Integration of all the related laws, rules and codes.
- Any building irrespective of height must have workable fire-safety arrangements.
- Change people's mindset.
- Fire Brigade should have engineering and investigation wings.
- Mandatory fire hazard insurance.
- Electrical wiring has to be in compliance with the national electrical code.
- Avoiding highly flammable construction materials.
- Single-riser gas-supply line at buildings.
- Strengthening the Fire Service and Civil Defence Directorate.
- Rectification of buildings built before Fire Prevention and Dousing Act, 2003, and Building Construction Rules, 2006.
- Wasa and DCC should install hydrant points at public places.
- Fire extinguishers and refilling stations must be made easy to find.
- Mandatory fireproof door for kitchens, smoke detectors and alarm bells for residences.
- Fire exits in all buildings.
- Regular (quarterly) fire drills at all buildings.
- Specialised fire-protection engineering course at university level.
- Compensation for death in fire at commercial buildings.
- Forming a volunteers' pool of fire fighters.
- Larger role of the media for building public awareness.
