



#### 80pc Wasa water being misused

## MPs to have major role in governing bodies

Political influence on non-government educational institutions is expected to soar again as the government prepares to enact a law regarding their management that will allow lawmakers and politicians to have a major role in the running of schools and colleges.

Earlier, an ordinance promulgated by the caretaker government to prevent political influence in the running of educational institutions lapsed as it was not ratified by the present government.

that proposals being considered for the fresh law provide for strengthening of local lawmakers' and political leaders' dominance over managing committees of non-government institutions.

There are around 30,000 nongovernment high schools, colleges and madrasas in the country, which are run by managing or governing bodies. Most of these institutions have different types of problems centring the managing or governing bodies.

The government institutions, however, are not run by managing committees.

## Suspected US missiles kill 13 in Pakistan

4 others killed in suicide bombing

A suspected US drone fired two missiles at an alleged militant hide-out Saturday in northwestern Pakistan, killing 13 people in the latest strike aimed at extremists who pose a threat to international troops in Afghanistan, intelligence officials and residents said.

Meanwhile, at least four people were killed when a suicide bomber blew himself up near a paramilitary checkpost in tribal Pakistan Saturday, police and hospital officials said.

"A suicide bomber wanted to target a convoy of troops but blew himself up after his

vehicle came under fire from a nearby paramilitary checkpost," a local tribal police official Mir Janat Khan said.

He added four civilians were killed and 19 others wounded, three of them paramilitary soldiers. The US is suspected of carrying out more

than three dozen such strikes over the past year in Pakistan near the Afghan border, where militants often launch attacks against US and Nato troops in Afghanistan. The drone attacks have caused tension with the Pakistani government, which frequently complains about the

#### Lankan troops kill 18 rebels in sea battle

Sri Lankan security forces destroyed three Tamil Tiger boats yesterday and killed at least 18 guerrillas trying to escape a major military ground offensive, defence officials said.

Tiger rebels are battling to resist an military assault that has pushed them into a 20square-kilometre (eightsquare-mile) patch of land in the northeast coastal district of Mullaittivu.
