Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina vesterday said her government would take effective steps to stop dropout of students from schools.


She made the remark when Sri Lankan High Commissioner in Dhaka V Krishnamoorthy called on her at the Prime Minister's Office (PMO) in the morning.
