Sri Lanka rewarded a Pakistani coach driver with 21,800 dollars for his role in protecting the island's cricket team during last month's gun and grenade attack in Lahore in a ceremony held at Colombo.

Meher Mohammad Khalil was hailed as a hero for driving the team to safety after their coach was attacked by suspected Muslim militants in the Pakistani city on March 3.

"I did it for Pakistan. I did it for Sri Lanka, who were our guests," Khalil said at the ceremony, during which he was given 21,800 dollars donated by Sri Lanka Cricket | Indies against Australia in 2003. (SLC), the Sports Ministry and private companies.

"Khalil, you are our hero. We will always remember you with gratitude," said Mahela Jayawardene, the former Sri Lankan skipper on the Pakistan tour.

India were on the brink of their first series win in New Zealand since 1968 after the hosts lost four second-innings wickets still needing 450 runs for victory in the third Test in Wellington for 35 respectively. on Monday.

New Zealand were struggling at 167 for four when bad light stopped play almost an hour early on the fourth day, after being set a massive target of 617 to win the final Test.

India had a 1-0 lead coming into the Test at the Basin Reserve and a draw would be enough to clinch their first series win in New Zealand for more than four decades.

Victory for New Zealand is out of reach, with the highest fourth innings winning total in Test cricket history being 418 scored by the West

New Zealand's remaining batsmen face the imposing task of trying to survive the final day, with forecast rain their best chance of salvaging

New Zealand have had their backs against the wall since Saturday, when they were dismissed cheaply for 197 in reply to India's first innings total of 379.

India's second innings was built on the bedrock of a magnificent 167 by opener Gautam Gambhir, who batted for nearly six hours Saturday and Sunday for his second century of the series.

India resumed at 349 for five on Monday and added another 85 runs, with captain Mahendra Singh Dhoni ending unbeaten on 56 before he declared 75 minutes into the morning session.

India cricketer and former captain Rahul Dravid has broken the world record for the number of catches in Test matches by an outfielder.

When Dravid helped to dismiss the New Zealand batsman Tim McIntosh on Monday it was his 182nd catch in a Test career going back to 1996.

Dravid's landmark was reached on the fourth day of India's third Test match against New Zealand at Wellington.

The previous record holder was Mark Waugh of Australia.

Dravid, 36, is now clearly ahead of Ricky Ponting (148 catches in 131 Tests), Jacques Kallis (147 catches in 131) and Mahela Jayawardene (142 catches in 102) among current players.

"Dravid has spent a lifetime in Sachin Tendulkar's shadow and the big batting records -centuries, number of runs scored -- were never going to be his, but he is quite on his own in the slips," according to Sambit Bal, editor of cricinfo.com, a cricket website.

Last year, Dravid became only the sixth batsman in history to score 10,000 Test runs.

He has compiled 26 Test centuries and 56 fifties, earning the nickname "The Wall" for his obdurate style of play. Dravid, who was appointed

the captain of the Indian team in October 2005, resigned from the job in September 2007. He captained India in 25 Tests -- winning eight, losing

six and drawing 11 -- and 79 one-day internationals.

'Let Sunil buy a team'

Riders (KKR) hit back at Indian batting legend Sunil Gavaskar over his comments about franchise coach John Buchanan, and has asked Gavaskar to stay away from issues concerning his Indian Premier League (IPL) team at a press conference in Mumbai on Sunday.

In his column for the Hindustan Times, Gavaskar termed Buchanan a "failed former cricketer making a living telling international players to do what he couldn't do". It has not gone down well with the IPL franchise, which last week tried to put a lid on the controversy generated by Buchanan's theory of multiple captains by releasing a statement that during a game the team would resort to a group of "strategists" who would report to one on-field captain while making decisions.

Shah Rukh has come to Buchanan's defence, saying there was a marked difference in the time Gavaskar played and now. "I respect Mr Gavaskar -- his knowledge about cricket is a billion times better than me," Shah Rukh told reporters in Mumbai. "But this is an era where Mr Gavaskar has not indulged in: nevertheless his knowledge

about the game does allow

him to make comments." "This is a new format that's being tried out. Please give it some breathing space. I am the owner of the team, I bought it. If he wants to implement something, let him buy a team."

Gavaskar was scathing of

Buchanan in his column, saying the former Australian coach had a way with words in India, a country Gavaskar said had few people capable of defusing opinion makers. "To comment on his multiple skipper theory is to give it the
