They alleged that the admission fee has been increased by Tk 505 this year and the authorities haver Introduced some unacceptable' fees, including medical fee and charges for paying the salaries of the college night guards and peons. Students said the college does not have

any kind of medical facilities. The agitating students threatened that they would not go back to their classes and examinations until their demands are met.

College Principal Prof Laila Arjumand Banu told The Daily Star that the fee was increased following government instructions.

Helal made BSS chief editor


