However, the department of shipping later cancelled the NOC as they came to know that Madina Enterprise provided incorrect information about the

ship, the documents say. The Supreme Court recently directed the government to take clearance certificate from the department of environment before importing any ship for scrapping. The court also directed not to import any poisonous Greenpeaceblacklisted ships and to clean up all ships before they enter Bangladesh territory.
