## Russia offers financial, technological help

Pilot project study next month

UNB, Dhaka

Russia, already on negotiation with Bangladesh for building a nuclear power plant, now offered to provide both technical and financial support for setting up small hydropower plants for catering area-based demands.

As per proposal, the hydropower plants, each having 10-20-megawatt capacity, will be built through creating small dams on different rivers.

Under the concept electricity will be generated through utiliging the streams of rivers.

This new Russian offer came when Ambassador Dr Gennady P Trotsenko yesterday met Prime Minister's Adviser Dr Taufiq-E-Elahi Chowdhury Birbikram at his office in Power Ministry.
