No significant progress was made in the last ment on implementation of the three large power projects, earlier planned to be implemented as independent power producers (IPPs).

The projects are 450 MW Bibiyana combined cycle (CC) plant, 450 MW Sirajganj CC plant and 450 MW Meghnaghat power plant phase-II.

All the projects were undertaken for implementation in the private sector on build-ownconstraints.

CMP launches automated criminal database

Chittagong Metropolitan Police (CMP) here yesterday launched the country's first automated criminal database system (CDS) with fingerprint identification to easily find out information about the criminals stored in different police stations.

Shipping Minister Afsarul Amin as the chief guest inaugurated the system at a function at a city hotel with CMP Commissioner Md Moniruzzaman in the chair.

Commodore RU Ahmed, DIG of Police (Chittagong Range) Md Asaduzzaman Mia and were present as the special guests.

The minister in his speech underscored the need for development of information technology (IT) in every sector to deal with modern digital world and facilitate the service level up gradually. to the mark.

Terming the launching of CDS 'timely step', the minister hoped that the system would help CMP in combating criminals in order to free the society of crime.

Such initiatives would immensely help the government materialise the vision of transforming the country into a digital Bangladesh by 2021 when the golden jubilee of the hard earned independence, he added.

Speakers said police have to face enormous problems in collecting, analysing and retrieving required information about any arrested criminals as the traditional criminal record keeping system is cumbersome and time-

They hoped that the newly introduced Chittagong Port Authority (CPA) Chairman automation system would allow police to access the essential information in short time.

The CMP commissioner told The Daily Star Chairman of Corporate IT Ltd Sajjadul Hasan that primarily the system would be introduced in three out of 12 police stations in the city, including Double Mooring, Pahartali and Halishahar, while the rest of the police stations would be brought under the system

Former assistant commissioner of Double Mooring zone Md Iltut Mish, recently posted to Rab, initiated the programme last year.







