All closed mills to be reopened Says Monnujan

State Minister for Labour and Employment Monnujan Sufian assured that all the closed mills and factories in the country would be reopened in a reversal of the policy prescribed by donor agencies and pursued by previous regimes.

She spoke of the new government's move at a meeting of workers organised by Sramik League, the labour wing of the ruling Awami League, at the poura

auditorium here yesterday. "The profitable mills and factories were first denationalised during the regime of late president Ziaur Rahman, turning those into nonprofitable concerns. In continuity of the policy, mills and factories were shut down one after another, rendering thousands of workers jobless," she toldher audience.

The state minister also deplored that Khaleda Zia "formed alliance with war criminals and patronised them as she doesn't support the War of Liberation".

She alerted all against "the misdeeds of anti-liberation forces".

Sramik League district unit President Saiful Karim, lawmakers Sheikh Mujibur Rahman and MA Jabbar also addressed the meeting.

TRIAL OF WAR CRIMINALS

Int'l organisations to observe trial process

Says minister

Several international organisations have been invited to Bangladesh only to observe the process of trial of war criminals, not to conduct the trial, Planning Minister AK Khandker said yesterday.

The international organisations will observe whether the trial is being held in a transparent way, he said at a view exchange meeting with the students of Bangladesh University of Engineering and Technology (Buet) at its auditorium.

AK Khandker, also the chairman of Sector Commanders' Forum (SCF),

said those who undermined the Liberation War by terming it 'civil war' should be arrested on sedition charges.

He said, "Anybody having

records of war crimes must stand trial even if they join Awami League hiding their past." He also said, "I don't know how long it will take to com-

plete the trial process, but I am sure the war criminals must be tried in this soil." The trial is a must for estab-

lishing justice in the country, he added. He said prosecutors, judges and investigators would be
