Turabi's Popular Congress party called for a government of national unity to prepare the country for elections scheduled for February next

People aged "60, 70 or 77 like myself, they have children who can become president. My son is now 40 years, and then you have even grandchildren who can join the parliament. So it is better to leave it for other generations," he told reporters at party headquarters.

"It is better to present new people, a new generation for new times. If you are a very wise person you sit back and write books that guide us, that inspire us, or lecture to us,... but don't put yourself forward. I don't have that much energy," Turabi said on the sidelines of a news confer-

Sudan's electoral commission announced last week that presidential, parliamentary and regional elections will be held in February 2010 -- the first proper elections in Africa's largest country since

Turabi is a former mentor of Beshir, having backed him when he toppled a three-yearold democratically elected government in a bloodless coup in June 1989.

Beshir is wanted by the International Criminal Court for alleged crimes committed during the six-year conflict in

The meeting -- the biggest international gathering since the G20 summit in London earlier this month -- grouped the 10-member Association of Southeast Asian Nations (Asean) with China, Japan, South Korea, India, Australia and New Zealand.

Protesters said they had run out of patience with Abhisit's refusal to bow to their demands for his resignation, and that they were angry at the wounding of several supporters in earlier clashes with pro-government rivals.

"The 'Red Shirts' have been asking him to resign for four months and we decided that now was the time to push him," Pichet Sukjindatong, one of the protest leaders, told AFP inside the building.

Hooting horns and triumphantly chanting slogans, anti-government protesters decked out in red pushed past lines of troops who carried shields and batons but offered little resistance.

They toppled metal detectors, smashed reception tables and left behind small polls of blood where some had been injured by glass.

About 100 demonstrators got as far as the driveway of an adjacent building where Asean leaders were holding a lunch meeting to thrash out a new schedule for the talks, after protest blockades had scrapped the morning's itin-

Hotel staff quickly cleared the restaurants and hustled bikini-clad tourists out of the pool as the protesters staged a sit-in rally at the heart of the summit, blocked by security forces with flak jackets and shotguns.

Within minutes of the cancellation, several foreign leaders including Philippine President Gloria Arroyo and Abhisit himself were airlifted to a nearby military airbase where emergency planes were on standby.

The principal alleged that 'the unruly students' confined all the teachers, including him, to the office denying the verbal assurance of the vicechancellor.

The students alleged that they placed their demand before the principal several times for reducing the exam fees, increasing facilities in hostels and transport facilities and relocating the exam centre at the college but the principal did not pay heed to their demand that led to take such agitation.

The college students-Mehedi, Asad, Nurul Islam, Bacchu and Shafiqul Islam--are among the injured persons.

except in fiscal 2000-01, original ADP allocations every year were cut during revision. Again, 80 to 96 per cent of each revised ADP could be implemented.

Only in 2000-01, the original ADP allocation of Tk 17,500 crore was increased to Tk 18,200 crore in the revised ADP. But the implementation in terms of money involved only Tk 16, 240 crore or 89 per cent of the revised allocation. Till date, the highest ADP

implementation in terms of money was in fiscal 2005-06 --Tk 19,473 crore. The original allocation was Tk 24,500 crore, and it was revised to Tk 21,500

In the last fiscal year, Tk 26,500 ADP allocation was revised to Tk 22,500 crore but implementation involved Tk 18,300 crore only.

In the current FY, for the first time the ADP was downsized to Tk 25,600 crore from the previous year's original ADP. But in the first eight months, only 34 per cent of the original ADP was 8,809 crore.

BIDS (Bangladesh Institute of Development Studies) research director Zaid Bakht said. "As I have seen in the last eight years, a maximum of 77 per cent of the original ADP could be implemented. However, in the present context, public investment is required for making the economy

If public investment increases, employment generation would get a boost go up creating increased demands in

the economy, he said. But the problem is that only increasing the ADP size would not work, its

implementation is important. Zaid further said if the ADP cannot be implemented properly, there remains a possibility of wastage of government funds. So, ADP allocation should not cross Tk 25,000 crore. If the ADP size is of Tk 25,000 crore, the government is likely to be able to utilise Tk 22,000 crore to Tk 23,000 crore in implementing it.

World Bank (WB) senior economist Zahid Hossain said a hugely expanded ADP size this year would be justified since it is consistent with the country's investment priorities: power generation, rural and urban infrastructure and basic educa-

The government needs to provide some fiscal space to face the impact of global financial crisis. But it is too early to make specific financial commitments for particular packages at this stage. "To maintain fiscal flexibility, in my view, the implemented, involving Tk ADP size should not exceed Tk 250-260 billion," he said.

The WB economist said the problems in ADP implementation seen for long are include delay in getting land, taking long time in project preparation and approval, lack of experienced staff, court cases concerning many projects and delay in release of funds.

"I don't think these problems can be resolved in a year. Without addressing these, increasing the ADP size would not produce any positive result," he said.

Al-Maliki later said the government crackdown which escalated into two-day gunbattle was not politically motivated but followed a sixmonth investigation that tied the commander to crimes and subversion.

Saturday's blast came on the heels of a horrific explosion Friday, believed to have been carried out by Sunni extremists, when a suicide truck driver detonated a ton of explosives near a police headquarters in the northern city of Mosul.

Five US soldiers were killed in the blast, the deadliest attack against American troops in more than a year.

Besides the five Americans, bombing were treated at the two Iraqi policemen also died hospital in the nearby town of and at least 62 people, including one American soldier and 27 civilians, were wounded, US and Iraqi officials said.
