Tk 135cr misused by Gram Sarkar in 4yrs

JS body asks ministry to investigate the graft during BNP rule

STAFF CORRESPONDENT

The parliamentary standing committee on local government yesterday alleged that members of the now-defunct Gram Sarkar units misused and embezzled Tk 135 crore during the last BNP-led government.

It asked the LGRD and Cooperatives Ministry to investigate the wastage of public money and submit a detailed report on the allocation of money at the committee's next meeting.

Now scrutinising the Local

Government (city corporation) Bill, the members of the committee proposed two deputy mayor posts, one exclusively for women, for each city corporation, meetings sources said.

In consultation with Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina, the committee will finalise its recommendations to this effect, the sources added.

On the allegation of embezzlement of public money, committee Chairman Rahmat Ali said there were many incidents of conflict over sharing the embezzled money.

"I had to experience such conflicts in my own constituency," he told reporters after the meeting at the Jatiya Sangsad Bhaban.

The BNP-led alliance government introduced the Gram Sarkar system in 2003 saying the units will assist the union parishads. But the system became controversial as the Gram Sarkar units consisted of the local individuals, most of them loyal to the then ruling BNP.

The then BNP government allocated Tk 181 crore for Gram Sarkar in four fiscal

40pc railway land occupied illegally

Roundtable told

Over 40 percent of the land belonging to Bangladesh Railway (BR) has been encroached over the years, proper use of which could make the railway a very profitable sector, speakers told a roundtable yesterday.

The railway sector has the potential to be developed as the cheapest and most convenient mass transport system of the country, they said.

The roundtable on 'Role of railway in the development of economy, communication, and budget' was organised by Rail Unnayan

Jote, Save Environment Movement (SEM) and Work for a Better Bangladesh Trust (WBB) at the National Press Club.

It was pointed out in the keynote speech that out of a total 63,127 acres, 25,456 acres of land belonging to the railway authority has been encroached.

The railway sector has been largely ignored and neglected since the independence of the country, speakers said pointing out that different organisations owe a total amount of Tk 12,000 crore to Bangladesh Railway in unpaid costs for carriage of goods.

Suicide car bomber kills 19 in Pakistan

A suicide bomber blew up a vehicle packed with explosives at a police checkpoint in northwest Pakistan, killing 19 police and civilians, officials said yesterday.

Pakistani security troops are frequent targets for extremist militants who oppose the government's alliance in the US-led "war on terror" and more than 1,500 government forces have been killed by insurgents since 2002.

The bomber blew himself up late Wednesday in Charsadda, just north of Peshawar in the North West Frontier Province.

"Police were searching a vehicle when a mini-truck came and blew up," senior police official Sefwat Ghayour told AFP.

"One more civilian succumbed to his wounds in a hospital in
