

NEW DANGER SIGNAL SYSTEM

Awareness campaign in coastal belts soon

UNB, Dhaka

The government plans to launch a massive awareness campaign soon among the people in the coastal belts before introducing the new storm danger signal system to be initiated before November, usually a month of depression in the Bay of Bengal.

The new danger signaling system, which already got approval of the cabinet division, was prepared by the last caretaker government with a view to making it easily understandable for the people.

"Massive campaign will be launched soon among the people in the coastal belt before formally introducing the new signaling system," a senior official at the Ministry of Disaster Management told UNB yesterday.

He said the government would take initiative to widely publicise the new weather signaling system. "All modes of media will be used to disseminate the message."

The official said there are some 42,500 volunteers ready to go into action in the coastal areas and they would be given further training to help implement the weather campaign before introducing the new signaling system.

He said, "As storm usually occurs in April-May-June and October-November periods in

our country, full campaign (on the new system) will be launched keeping the timeframe in mind."

The new signaling system will be applicable in case of both maritime ports and river ports, said sources at the Meteorology Department.

According to the new system, there will be eight warnings for the maritime ports and six for river ports, said Shah Alam, deputy director of the Meteorological Department, at a workshop in the city on Saturday.

Of the signals, 5 and 7 will be omitted, with maritime ports having recourse to signals 1, 2, 3, 4, 6, 8, 9 and 10, while river ports will accordingly hoist 3, 4, 6, 8, 9 and 10 on the same scale ranging from cautionary to great danger.

According to Met office documents, the restructured danger signal numbers would be measured the following way -- distant warning signal number 1 and distant cautionary signal number 2 will be measured with the wind speed of 51-61 and 62-88 kilometers per hour while local cautionary signal number 3 and local warning signal 4 with the wind speed of 40-50 and 51-61 kilometers per hour, danger signal number 6 with the wind speed of 62-88, the greater danger signal 8 with the wind speed of 89-117, signal 9 with 118-170 and signal 10 above with 171 kilometers per hour.

Call to stop anti-militancy drives in Quami madrasas

Islamic scholars yesterday demanded an immediate halt to the recent anti-militancy drives in Quami madrasas and stoppage of 'propaganda' against the madrasas of patronising militancy in the country.

Quami madrasa leaders also postponed their scheduled rally in protest against the recent anti-militancy drives as the prime minister assured them of stopping police harassment in the madrasas and taking steps to modernise Quami madrasa education keeping its 'unique' methodology of teaching.

The rally was scheduled for today under the banner of Bangladesh Quami Madrasa Education Board.

"As per the prime minister's assurance of stopping drives in Quami madrasas, we postponed the scheduled rally and urged all Islamic scholars to join the seminar," Abdul Zabbar, a leader who joined the meeting with the premier on Saturday, said at a press conference at the National Press Club.

The leader said they would hold a national seminar on anti-terrorism and militancy on April 25 as part of their promise of helping the government in identifying the patrons of militancy and bringing them to book.

Leaders also demanded withdrawal of, what they said, 'unaccepted' comments about Quami madrasas made by the law minister, telecommunications minister and director general of the Islamic Foundation.

Meanwhile, Islami Andolok Bangladesh (IAB) at a rally urged the government not to harass the Quami madrasa students in the name of detecting militancy there.

They also demanded withdrawal of the remarks by the law minister on Quami madrasa that the Quami madrasas are breeding places of militancy in the country and removal of Baitul Mukarram Mosque Khatib Maulana Salauddin and education commission chief Prof Kabir Chowdhury.

The rally was organised by Islami Andolok Dhaka city unit at Muktangan in the city with IAB Dhaka city unit President ATM Hemayet Uddin in the chair.

Addressing the rally as the chief guest, IAB President Charmonai Pir Syed Rezaul Karim said the government in its election manifesto said it would not do anything against Islam, but some persons of the government are trying to hatch conspiracies against the religion.

He said Quami madrasa students are not militants, rather those who are creating mayhem in different education institutions are the real militants.

HISTORY OF WAR OF INDEPENDENCE

Petition for banning books for distorting history

He said the Ministry of Liberation War Affairs on approval of then Prime Minister Khaleda Zia formed an authentication committee comprising Md Rejaul Karim, Prof M Moniruzzaman Mia, Prof Emauzzuddin Ahmed, Barrister Moinul Hossain, Dr Kamal Uddin Siddiki, Prof Sirajul Islam, Prof KM Mohsin, Prof Abdul Kalam Monjur Morshed and Prof Jasim Uddin Ahmed to reprint the 15-volume books.

Dr MA Salam, a freedom fighter and a private practitioner, filed a writ petition as a public interest litigation (PIL) praying to the court to direct the government to take action against the persons who changed the real history in the name of reprint.

After holding a hearing on the petition, an HC bench of Justice ABM Khairul Haque and Justice Md Mamtauzzuddin Ahmed fixed Monday (today) for order on the petition.

During the hearing, petitioner's counsel Advocate Manzill Murshid told the court that then government on February 13, 1979 constituted an authentication committee for writing and printing of History of Bangladesh War of Liberation.

Dr Mofizullah Kabir was appointed chairman and Hasan Hafizur Rahman member secretary of the committee.

The committee published the books in November 1982 and subsequently it was reprinted in December 2003.

In both the publications, it was written that Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman made declaration of independence on March 26, 1971, he said, adding that it was recognised in the Proclamation on

March 26, 1971, he said.

He also said those who were responsible for distort-

ing the national history had committed offence against the state and violated the Constitution.

During the hearing, the court assigned senior lawyer Barrister M Amir-Ul Islam who was involved in drafting the Proclamation of Independence, as an amicus curiae (friend of court) to make submissions on the issue.

Amir-Ul Islam told the court that the Proclamation of Independence, which has been protected by Article 150 of the Constitution, is a legal document and it cannot be changed.

Eight high officials of the government, including the secretaries of the cabinet division, the president secretariat and the office of the prime minister, have been made respondents in the petition.

Unilever distributor mugged of Tk 17.30 lakh

A distributor of Unilever Company was mugged of Tk 17.30 lakh at Chandpur crossing in Sadar upazila yesterday.

Local sources said a number of armed muggers, numbering 4 to 5, swooped on Abdul Baten Liton, owner of distributing agency ST Enterprise, when he got down from his car near the BRAC Bank along with Tk 17.30 lakh at about 12:30pm yesterday.

The snatchers fired two blank shots creating panic among the local people.

They beat up Abdul Baten and snatched away his bag containing the money.

The muggers also forcibly pulled the driver out of Baten's car at gunpoint and fled the scene by car.

During the brawl, Baten snatched a loaded pistol from the muggers. He deposited the firearm with the Joydevpur police station. The car was later found in a nearby bus stand area in the town.

The museum authorities received the land at over Tk 1.49 crore of which the market price is around 82 crore, ministry sources said.

Since its journey at Segun Bagicha in 1996, the museum is housed in a rented house. A number of important historical elements of the liberation war cannot display for the people due to the lack of space in the existing place.


