Manmohan, Advani trade barbs for top job

For all the talk of a fractured electoral mandate and important role of regional parties and their leaders, the campaign for Indian parliamentary election has so far been more about two personalities -- about a Prime Minister "by accident" Manmohan Singh and his main challenger LK Advani aspiring for the top job.

Singh, 76, of ruling Congress and 81-year-old Advani of BJP have hogged media attention as they launched an all-out war of words against each other, much to the chagrin of regional and Left parties which accused the two principal contenders for power of trivialising the political

discourse.

Whatever one may say about issues figuring in elections, polls in Indian sub-continent have also been about certain personalities and India is no exception.

Though both were born in what is present-day Pakistan, Singh and Advani are a study in star contrasts. While Advani is a career politician rising from grassroots as a RSS activist, Singh, a leading economist who had headed the country's central bank, is an accidental prime minister on whom the mantle fell after Congress chief Sonia Gandhi played out the renunciation act five years ago.

During the electioneering, Advani has accused Manmohan Singh of being the "weakest

PM" India has ever had and insinuated that the real power centre was Sonia Gandhi.

Congress retaliated by questioning BJP's "decency" in attacking their PM and launched their bitterest attack on Advani with four key leaders Rahul Gandhi, Priyanka Gandhi, Sonia Gandhi and Manmohan Singh himself - casting serious doubts on Advani's ability to serve as PM.

The Congress leaders raked up the issue of releasing four terrorists to save the lives of 153 passengers of a hijacked Indian Airlines plane to Kandahar, Afghanistan, in December 1999, during BJP-led NDA rule when Advani had been Home Minister.

3,000 more civilians flee Lankan war zone

Nearly 3,000 civilians escaped from Sri Lanka's war zone and sought shelter with security forces, the defence ministry said yesterday as troops stepped up an offensive against cornered Tiger rebels.

The non-combatants escaped Saturday evening from the remaining area under the control of the Liberation Tigers of Tamil Eelam (LTTE), the ministry said in a statement.

"The civilians started arriving in large groups since (Saturday) afternoon using the safe routes opened for them by troops," the ministry said.

The influx into government-held territory was in contrast to the trickle of civilians that came through when the military observed a unilateral two-day truce earlier in the week, the ministry noted.

Security forces kept up their offensive against Tamil Tiger rebels trapped in a

government-declared "no-fire zone," ignoring international appeals for a ceasefire.

At least 17 rebels were killed and another 22 wounded in fighting Saturday, the government said.

"Battlefield reports indicated that troops have encountered stiff resistance from the terrorists," it said.

President Mahinda Rajapakse told party workers at his tightly guarded residence in Colombo Saturday that the decimated Tamil Tigers faced a stark choice.

"They have only three alternatives. Either they have to surrender to our armed forces, eat the cyanide capsule (worn round their necks) and commit suicide, or plunge into the sea," he said.

Rajapakse said the international community should stop putting pressure on him for another ceasefire and instead ask Tiger rebels to free civilians in the conflict zone.

The United Nations says up to 100,000

civilians are trapped in the area in "dire humanitarian conditions."

The government has accused the Tigers of holding the civilians as a human shield, a charge denied by the guerrillas, who are trying to prevent a total defeat after fighting for 37 years for a separate state.

UN chief Ban Ki-moon last week sent his chief of staff, Vijay Nambiar, for talks with Sri Lankan leaders to extend the ceasefire but was rebuffed, officials said.

Britain's Foreign Secretary David Miliband said at the weekend he would ask Nambiar to report to the UN Security Council "immediately" on his return.

"I remain gravely concerned at the continuing conflict in northern Sri Lanka that threatens many thousands of civilian lives," Miliband said in a statement.

"The British government maintains its calls for an immediate ceasefire in Sri Lanka and for civilians to be allowed to leave the conflict area."

Pakistan 'in danger', says Musharraf

Warning that Pakistan "is in danger", former President Pervez Musharraf on Sunday said its leadership must take cognisance of concerns expressed by world community about security situation in the country but asserted that nobody should dictate any course of action to it.

"The country is in danger and if we get bogged down in minor and old issues, there will be problems," Musharraf told reporters at the airport here before he embarked on a visit to Saudi Arabia.

"The issue is very serious. Everyone in the world is seeing the seriousness of the issue in Pakistan. Everyone is trying to chart a course of action," he said. At the same time, he said, Pakistan must chart its own course of action to steer the country out of the problems it is facing.

BJP solely to blame for Babri Mosque demolition: PM

Indian Prime Minister Manmohan Singh Sunday rejected Rashtriya Janata Dal (RJD) supreme Lalu Prasad's charge that the Congress too was to blame for Babri Masjid, saying the BJP was solely responsible for the 1992 mosque demolition.

Addressing a press conference in Amin Gaon in Guwahati, the prime minister also said he would prefer to put an end to the slanging match with Bharatiya Janata Party's (BJP) prime ministerial candidate L.K. Advani.

"We can't be blamed," the prime minister said replying to a question on his reaction to Lalu Prasad's remark on the Babri razing. He said that the then BJP chief minister of Uttar Pradesh Kalyan Singh 'did what he did' despite his affidavit to the apex court that he will protect the 16th century disputed structure.

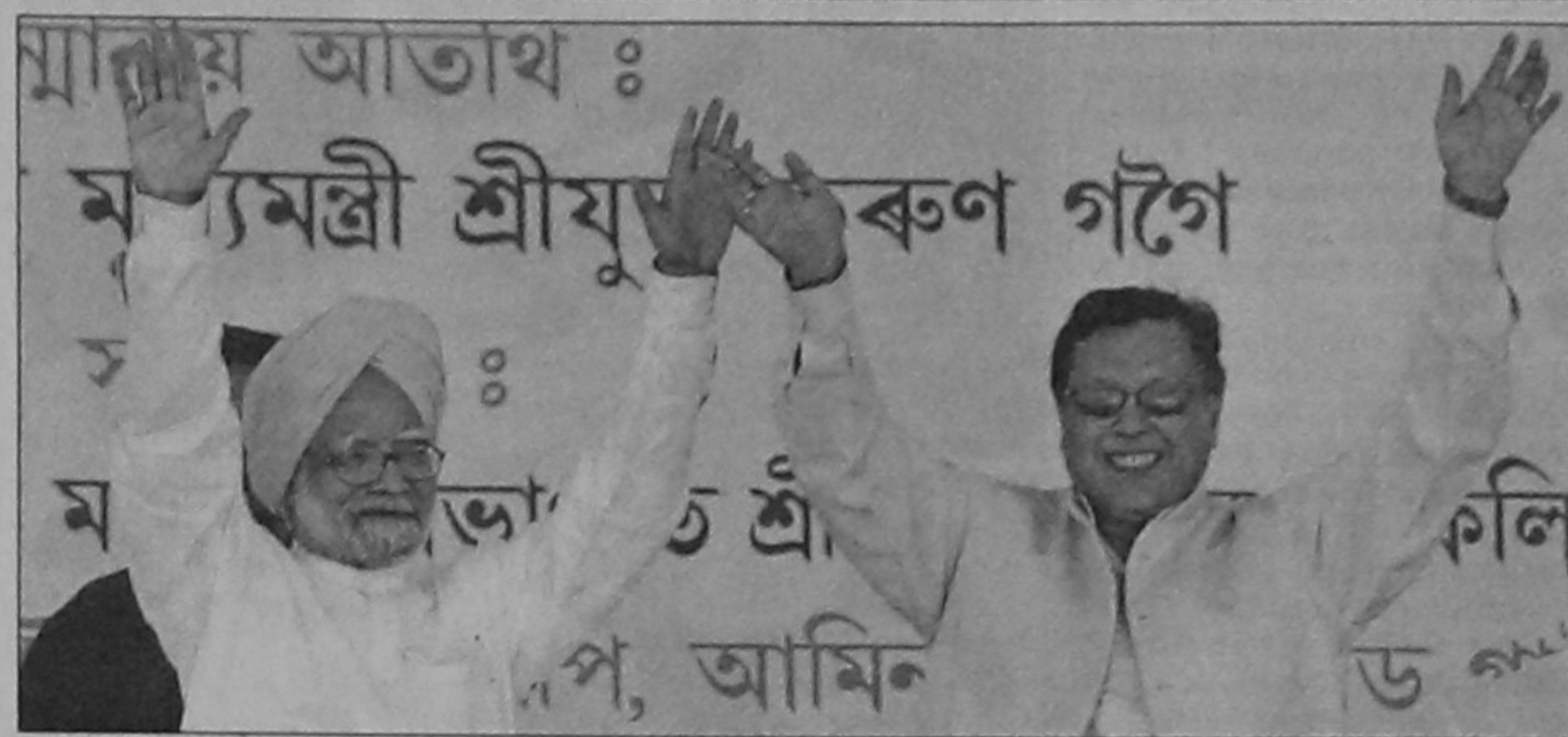
