

Death anniversary of Sher-e-Bangla today

Today is the 47th death anniversary of noted politician Sher-e-Bangla AK Fazlul

Haque. The nation will observe the day with due respect. Different socio-political organisations have chalked out elaborate programmes to mark the day.

In separate massages, President Mohammad Zillur Rahman and Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina paid rich tributes to the leader who had fought for the downtrodden throughout his life.

At a press briefing held at the BNP chairperson's Gulshan office in the city, former foreign secretary Shamsher Mobin Chowdhury, also an adviser to the BNP chairperson, said at least four meetings were held in Saudi Arabia and Kuala Lumpur between former premier Khaleda Zia and the Saudi king
