

Body found in N'ganj

Police recovered the body of a youth from Panchabati BSIC industrial area in Narayanganj early yesterday.

The dead was identified as Senu Mia, 26, son of late Gias Uddin of Fatullah.

Police suspected that he might have been killed as a sequel to previous feud with a tea stall owner in the area. His chest and throat were thrashed with bricks.

Police said few days back Senu locked into a quarrel with tea stall owner Rakib and Ashik on a trifling matter.

'Introduce unitrack education system'

Speakers at a discussion yesterday called on the government to introduce unitrack education system up to class eight in line with the Kudrat-e-Khuda Education Commission report.

They also called for allocation of at least five percent of Gross Domestic Products (GDP) for the education sector and steps to monitor whether the budget is being used properly.

The speakers also said the government should provide free education up to class eight under the unitrack system.

Sammiti Samajik Andolon organised the discussion at the Liberation War

Museum auditorium in the city.

Workers Party President Rashed Khan Menon MP said a comprehensive policy should be formulated for the unitrack system to eliminate discrimination in the education sector.

The government is also planning to have more control over Qaumi Madrasas, he said, adding that "But all decisions related to education would be taken on the basis of the report of Education Policy Formulation Committee."

Principal MA Awwal Siddiqui, member of the committee and president of Bangladesh Shikkha Samity, said, "If we can submit the report in time, the new education policy might be implemented by next year."

The government should also take the responsibility to ensure education for all, especially the poor, he said.

Human rights activist Dr Hameeda Hossain stressed the need to specify the medium of teaching -- whether it will be English or Bangla -- under the unitrack system.

Dr Syed Anwar Hossain expressed doubts about the activities of the Education Policy Formulation Committee, saying that most members of the committee were selected on political consideration.

Syed Jahangir presented the keynote paper at the discussion presided over by Prof Ajay Roy.
