



#### Qaumi madrasa leaders pledge to help root out militancy

Qaumi madrasa leaders at a seminar yesterday pledged all out support to the government to root out militancy from the country to establish a peaceful society.

The leaders were speaking at a national seminar titled "Role of Qaumi madrasas in nation building and curbing militancy' organised by Sammilita Qaumi Madrasah Shikkha Board Bangladesh at the Engineers' Institution auditorium in the city. Abdur Rahman, a Qaumi madrasa leader, presided over the seminar

Refuting the allegation against Qaumi madrasas of patronising militancy, they said thousands of young students have been studying the holy Quran and Hadith at Qaumi madrasas. Students and teachers of Qaumi madrasas cannot patronise militancy as they believe in Islam that teaches peace, they added.

They also demanded recognition of Qaumi madrasa education so that its present principle and unique style of teaching remain intact.

Rahman said they are ready to help the government if it (government) does not change present policy of Qaumi madrasas.

Regarding enrolment to Monthly Payment Order (MPO), he said they do not want to be enrolled under MPO if the government tries to impose control on Qaumi madrasas. Muslims will not accept it, he added.

Sammilita Qaumi Madrasah Shikkha Board Secretary Mizanur Rahman Sayeed read out a 10-point demand at the seminar that includes an end to propaganda by different quarters against Qaumi madrasas and teachers, halting the move to impose control over Qaumi madrasas, recognition of Daoraye Hadith certificate as equivalent to MA (masters' of arts), formation of an independent commission to be run by Qaumi madrasa leaders and stopping harassment of Qaumi madrasas across the country.

Senior leaders of the board and representatives from different Qaumi madrasas across the country also spoke at the seminar.

Flynn assumed her office in March in 2009 as CEO of ADD, an international NGO that operates in 12 countries of Africa and Asia to promote the rights of persons with disabilities. She brings a wealth of experience to the position, herself a person with a disability and a prominent leader of the disability movement in South Africa. Before joining ADD, she was the National Executive Director and CEO of the South African National Council for the Blind.

# Prevalence of acid violence declines: ASF

Prevalence of acid violence has declined compared to the first quarter of the previous year because of proactive role of different nongovernment organisations, the media and the government, according to Acid Survivors Foundation (ASF).

Some 20 people fell victim to acid violence from January to April this year, while the same period of the last year saw 42 victims, ASF Executive Director Monira Rahman said at a press conference yesterday.

"Acid violence had increased by 40 percent every year during the period from 1999 to 2002. If we had not taken necessary action to curb such violence, it would have shattered at least 4,668 lives in 2008, which saw a total of 178 victims," she

However, there is no reason to be complacent as acid violence is still taking place in the country, she added.

She also announced that ASF would organise the 1st International Conference of the Attenstitutions on Tuesday to mark the 10th anniversary of the organisa-

JCD leader assaulted by BCL men at DU

Some activists of Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) beat up a leader of Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD) on Dhaka University campus yesterday.

Campus sources said a group of 10-15 BCL men allegedly led by Sohel and Kutub of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman Hall seriously beat up JCD man Hafizur Rahman with iron rods, sticks and bottles of beverage in front of Madhu's canteen at around 1:00pm.

With serious injures in head and back, Hafiz was rushed to Dhaka Medical College Hospital. He was later shifted to Islami Bank Hospital while his condition was deteriorating.

JCD sources said Hafiz, assistant sport secretary of JCD Zia Hall unit, might have been beaten following a previous enmity with a BCL man of Bangabandhu Hall.

Beating JCD men up by BCL men has become a common phenomenon on the DU campus since Awami League assumed power early this year.


