#### Rab seizes illegal VoIP equipment

Members of Rapid Action Battalion (Rab)-3 seized VoIP (Voice over Internet Protocol) equipment worth around Tk 1 crore and arrested one person on Wednesday night in the capital's Ramna area.

The arrestee was identified as Mohammad Rustam Ali Hawladar, 48, son of Motaher Ali Hawlader of Jheelpar Mirbag area. He hails from Pirojpur sadar upazila.

On information, a detective team of Rab-3 led by Lt Mohammad Jarrar Hossain Khan and Assistant Superintendent of Police Mohammad Rajib Al Masud raided a building o Mohammad Nurul Haque of that area.

The team seized 120 pieces of fixed wireless terminals, 24 pieces of gateways, around 1000 SIM cards of different cellphone companies and a computer CPU from two flats.

Lt Jarrar Hossain told The Daily Star that Saiful Islam alias Shahriar Hossain, 30, along with Rustam ran the illegal VoIP business there over last two years.

He added that sensing presence of law enforcers in plainclothes, Shahriar managed to escape.




