## NSU-in-Brief

North South University, the first private university in Bangladesh, was established more than a decade ago by a group of philanthropists, industrialists, businessmen and academics.

The government of Bangladesh approved the establishment of North South University in 1992 under Private University Act (PUA) 1992. The university was formally inaugurated on 10 February 1993 by the then Prime Minister of Bangladesh. The honorable President of the People's Republic of Bangladesh is the Chancellor of NSU.

The University is run by a number of statutory bodies as required under the provisions of the Private Universities Act 1992. At the apex is the Board of Governors (BOG) of NSU. The BOG is the highest authority in the university. It is the Board of Governors, Mr. M.A. Awar, Mr. M.A. Kashem, Mr. Azim Uddin Ahmed, Mr. A.M. Kamal Uddin Khan, Mr. Muhammad Shaukat, Mr. M.A. Hashem, Mr. Mubashir Alam, Mr. Ragib Ali, Mr. Benazir Ahmed and Mrs. Rehana Rahman were the subsequent Chairpersons in chronological order. Mr. M.A. Awar is the current Chairman of BOG. The Chancellor presides over the BOG. The Chancellor is elected by the BOG. The Chancellor is the highest authority in the university. The university follows the American system with all its distinctive features – semester, credit hours, letter grades, one

exam system and so on. In accordance, when first introduced, were reviewed by relevant departments at University of Illinois, Urbana-Champaign, and University of California at Berkeley, USA, and duly approved by the University Grants Commission. The academic programs are continually updated and adapted to meet the local needs.

Since joining NSU in 1993, Dr. Hafiz G.A. Siddiqi, the current Vice-Chancellor, provided leadership in improving, expanding and diversifying various academic programs. NSU now has 100 core (Bachelors and 100 post-graduate) faculty members. Core faculty members have higher degrees from reputable foreign universities, with over 90% holding degrees from British, American, Australian and Canadian Universities. Visiting faculty from foreign universities including US, Canadian and Australian universities also teach at NSU. It is very inclusive of international students. In current student enrollment is about 1000.

NSU has three Institutes and one Center (i) Institute of Development, Environment and Strategic Studies (IDESS) (ii) The English Institute (iii) Confucius Institute, and (iv) Center of Information & Communication Technology (CICT).

**Convocation:** The first Convocation was held in December, 1996 when 96 graduates received their degrees. This year the NSU Chancellor conferred the degrees upon 1074 graduates at the 12th convocation, held on 17 May 2009. NSU has so far produced 4344 graduates.

**International Recognition:** The credits obtained at NSU are accepted in most of the respectable universities of USA, Canada, Australia and other countries. NSU graduates have been accepted in the Graduate programs of Harvard, Cornell, University of Pennsylvania, and other well-known universities. NSU attracts foreign students from India, Pakistan, Sri Lanka, Nepal, China, Japan, Thailand, Myanmar, Malaysia, Sudan, Kenya and Nigeria. In addition, under the Study Abroad and Group Exchange programs, students from world-class universities of the USA and Canada such as Brown University,

Penn State University of Illinois, Urbana-Champaign, Smith College, Mt. Holyoke College, Wesleyan University, York University, and other similar institutions attend summer sessions at NSU and transfer credits back to their institutions.

**NSU Collaborates with Foreign Universities:** NSU maintains academic collaboration with many foreign universities. Notable among these universities are (1) St. Xavier University, Chicago, USA; (2) Indiana University of Pennsylvania, USA; (3) Loma University, USA; (4) University of Delaware, USA; (5) University of Maryland, USA; (6) Queen University, Canada; (7) Yunnan University, China; (8) Mahidul University, Malaysia; (9) Wayne State University, USA; (10) University of South Australia, Australia; and (11) Kyung Hee University, South Korea. (12) University of Manitoba, Canada and (13) University of Bergen, Norway. NSU has also research collaborations with world class research institutes, like International Centre for Diarrhoeal Diseases Research (ICDDR,B), Dhaka in various academic programs in Biochemistry, Microbiology and Public Health.

**International Advisory Board:** NSU has an International Advisory Board, members of which include professors and administrators from foreign Universities and international organizations.

**Admission of International Applicants:** In most cases, international applicants seeking admission to NSU have to meet the same academic standards as those required for native students. International applicants are selected on the basis of their prior academic work. English proficiency, probability of success in the chosen curriculum (as evidenced by prior work in the academic area involved), and certification of adequate financial resources. **Publications:** English Department publishes the journal Panini. NSU studies in language & literature. Publication of NSU Journal of Business, Economics and Information Systems (JBIEIS) is in NSU's current program.

**Information Services:** Computer Center Information Services Department has 17 Computer labs. Over 200 computers are connected through Novell-based E-mail service, Internet facilities and Web access.

**Electronics, Digital Electronics, Telecommunications, Microprocessor and VLSI Laboratory:** North South University has a good number of Laboratories with most modern equipment such as Analog and Digital Trainers, Signal Generators and Function Generators, Oscilloscopes, multi-meters and Electronic components. Single-board Microcomputers, VLSI Laboratory with CPLD, FPGA and ASIC, Various Transmitters and Receivers, Fiber Optics Communications, Analog and Digital Modulation Equipment, Advanced Digital Communication Systems, I & II and Digital Signal Processor.

**Computer Laboratories:** The Computer Laboratories of North South University provide the best possible services to the university through general purpose laboratory and other specialized laboratories (such as Network Laboratory, Database Laboratory and General Purpose Laboratory) consisting of around 150 Pentium 4 (Dell & HP) 500 MHz Class (Sunny 100) and 10 high computational Sun workstations (Sunblade 150) and all are connected through Local Area Network (LAN) with Fiber-Optic & UTP cables.

**Pharmacy & Life Science Laboratory:** NSU has also dedicated laboratories for B. Pharm. Program. They include Inorganic & Physical Pharmacy lab, Physiology & Pharmacology lab.

**Pharmaceuticals, Bio-Pharmaceuticals & Pharmaceutical Technology lab, Microbiology lab and also an advanced laboratory in Molecular Biology and Biotechnology.**

**Student Activity Club:** Students participate in a wide range of extracurricular activities under 14 different Student Clubs.

**New NSU Campus and Dhaka:** The permanent campus of NSU, the foundation of which was laid by the Prime Minister of Bangladesh on January 2003, has reached completion. Thanks to the concerted efforts of the NSU Foundation, headed by its current Chairman, the University is shifting to its new campus. The new campus is a 12 million sq. ft. divided into 99 acres. Generous portions of space have been allotted to the library, classrooms, lecture theatres and other facilities for the students and the academic and non-academic staff. Brand new office and classroom furniture of the finest design will equip the campus. There are three basement levels providing ample parking space for 600 vehicles.

There are 2050 computers in 17 computer labs for the use of students. The faculty members and the office staff most of which are provided with Internet facilities. Wireless connectivity ensures fast and hassle-free access to cyber space.
