Xavi's best title ever

Barcelona playmaker Xavi expressed his delight at winning the Spanish championship saying the 2009 title gave him more satisfaction than his previous three triumphs.

The 29-year-old Spanish international had won the title with Barca in 1999, 2005 and 2006 but the pain of watching Real Madrid win the past two seasons made the 2009 title taste all the sweeter.

"This is my fourth league title and it is the one I have enjoyed most," Xavi told local newspaper Sport. "We have played offensive, ambitious football and there is no doubt about the talent we have here.

"Football is incredible because you can never stop to think about what you have done. A year ago they pillored us without mercy and now we

are heroes.' Andres Iniesta said the 6-2 thrashing of Real Madrid in 'El Clasico' at the Santiago Bernabeu was his highlight of the season.

"For me the 6-2 at the Bernabeu is above all other records," Iniesta said. "We didn't win the league there but it was great for all of us.

Manchester United clinched their third consecutive Premier League title with a 0-0 draw against Arsenal on Saturday. The point gave United an unassailable sevenpoint lead over Liverpool at the top, with their rivals hav-

ing just two games to go. At the other end of the table, Hull City moved out of the relegation zone thanks to a 1-1 draw at Bolton, lifting them one point above Newcastle, who were beaten 1-0 at home by Fulham.

Middlesbrough are in desperate trouble after they could only draw 1-1 with Aston Villa, leaving them three points away from safety, but with an inferior goal difference to their rivals.

Hull gave their survival hopes a massive boost as they drew 1-1 at Bolton Wanderers, where Craig Fagan's secondhalf goal equalized Gretar Steinsson's early opener.

Guardiola has come up trumps in his maiden season, surpassing all expectations as Barcelona ended two seasons without a trophy with a Spanish league and sons. Kings Cup double which could become an historic treble with the Champions League final still to come.

Figo to retire from football

Portuguese legend Luis Figo has announced his retirement from football after Inter Milan were crowned Serie A champi-

appeared close to retirement 12 months ago after falling out with former coach Roberto Mancini at the Giuseppe However, the appointment

of compatriot Jose Mourinho saw Figo agree to stay for another season and he has been involved on a regular

Reports have linked the former Barcelona and Real Madrid schemer with a move to Major League Soccer, but Figo suggests it is unlikely he will head to the United States.

He added: "I will not play again at the highest level and I will most likely not accept any

"Only if something special emerges, and it is from outside of Europe, but it is not likely."

Figo started his career with Sporting Lisbon in 1989 before moving to Barcelona in 1995 and then on to arch-rivals Real Madrid for a world record fee five years later.

He signed for Inter in 2005 and has won a string of major titles during a career which saw him win 127 caps for Portugal in addition to being named the European Footballer of the Year in 2000 and the World Player of the Year 12 months later.

Inter Milan won a fourth straight Serie A title on Saturday despite not playing when nearest challengers AC

Second-placed Milan trail Inter, who host Siena on Sunday, by seven points but the Rossonero have only two matches left to play.

Milan went into the game in Udine knowing that they had to get a result to stop their bitter city rivals claiming the title, but they put in one of their worst performances of the season in what could be one of coach Carlo Ancleotti's final matches in charge with rumours growing that he will join Chelsea next season.

The coach was magnanimous in defeat but was clearly unhappy with his players.

"Did Inter deserve the title? I think they've been the most consistent team and hence they deserved to win, "he said.

Tonight I wasn't expecting us to play as we did. We never turned up."
