They became the second IPL champions after Rajasthan Royals had lifted the trophy last year. Deccan were the bottom side in the first edition, making it a complete turnaround for their franchise.

The Hyderabad side defended a modest score of 143-6 thanks to some brilliant bowling and fielding as Bangalore were kept down to 137-9 in 20 overs.

The government has identified six projects for implementation on a 'very urgent' basis under the proposed publicprivate partnership (PPP) budget.

Except construction of a deep-sea port in Chittagong, the rest of the projects are estimated to cost \$11.05 billion or Tk 75,900 crore.

According to a finance ministry working paper on PPP, the projects are Dhaka-Chittagong Access Control Highway at an estimated cost of \$3.023 billion, construction of a sky rail around Dhaka city at a cost of \$2.8 billion, construction of a

# The High Court (HC) yesterday directed the government to take

appropriate steps to stop encroachment, earth-filling, and construction of illegal structures on the Buriganga, Turag, Balu, and Shitalakkhya rivers.

After hearing a writ petition, an HC bench of Justice ABM Khairul Haque and Justice Md Mamtazuddin Ahmed issued the ad-interim order and a ruling upon the government to explain within one week why it should not be directed to take initiatives to remove all illegal structures built on the earth-filled encroached upon sections of the rivers and on their banks.

A section of the ruling also asked the deputy commissioners (DC) of Dhaka, Narayanganj and Gazipur, the chairman of Bangladesh Inland Water Transport Authority (BIWTA), and the director general of the Directorate of Land Records and Survey to explain why they should not be directed to determine the original spans of the rivers by conducting surveys after forming a SEE PAGE 15 COL 1

## Troops battle to capture Swat's main town

18 militants killed in Pakistan fighting

Pakistan's military said yesterday it had seized several key areas in the Swat valley's Talibanheld main town, as their battle to regain control an estimated population of about 300,000 -of the northwest entered a crucial phase.

Troops moved into Mingora on Saturday, fighting street-by-street with Islamist insurgents who last month flouted a ceasefire agreement and moved toward the capital Islamabad, sparking a fierce US-backed military retalia-

She made the remark when Saudi Ambassador in Dhaka Dr Abdullah Bin Naser Al Busairi paid a courtesy call on her at the prime minister's office in the morning. During the meeting, the Saudi ambassador handed over to

the prime minister a letter of condolence from the Custodian of two Holy Mosques and Saudi King Abdullah Bin Abdul Aziz Al Saud on the death of her husband Dr MA Wazed Miah, an internationally renowned nuclear scientist. The Saudi King in his message said, "We have received the

news of sad demise of your husband Dr MA Wazed Miah. May Allah bless him."

The king continued, "While sending to your excellency and your bereaved family our deep condolence and true consolation we pray to Almighty Allah to cover his departed soul with His generous mercy and forgiveness, grant him the spacious place in heaven and save you from all unpleasant things."
