N Korea vows response if IJN imposes sanctions

North Korea yesterday threatened fresh steps to defend itself if world powers impose sanctions for its nuclear test, but the United States said it had enough troops in South Korea to protect its ally.

Tensions have been running high since Kim Jong-Il's regime tested a nuclear bomb on Monday for the second time and warned it could launch an attack on the South, renouncing the armistice

that ended the Korean War in 1953. North Korea Friday fired a short-range missile off its east coast, the sixth since it staged a nuclear test earlier this week,

South Korea's Yonhap news agency said.

The defence ministry declined comment but the news agency's reports of five missile launches earlier this week were later confirmed.

Tribal clashes in Sudan region kill 244

Clashes between two major Arab nomadic tribes in Sudan's South Kordofan region this past week have killed 244 people, including police officers, Interior Minister Ibrahim Mahmoud Hamad said Thursday,

"The toll of victims is 89 dead among the Misseriya, 80 among the Rizeqat and 75 in the central reserve (police), he told a cabinet meeting in Khartoum, the official Suna press agency reported.

Those responsible will be brought to justice and the authorities will take steps to disarm civilians, he added.

Emotional funeral for S Korea's Roh

A sea of wailing mourners filled the streets of Seoul for the funeral Friday of ex-President Roh Moo-hyun, whose suicide six days earlier amid a deepening corruption probe by the government plunged South Korea into grief and anger.

Heads bowed, thousands took part in a solemn ceremony in the courtyard of the 14th-century Gyeongbok Palace before the hearse carrying Roh's body headed to a grassy plaza outside City Hall for emotional public rites attended by a reported 500,000 people. Police in riot gear later moved in as the crush of mourners prevented the hearse from leaving the capital for a few hours.

Police dispatched some 21,000 officers to quell any protests by Roh supporters who accuse conservative political opponents led by President Lee Myung-bak of driving the liberal ex-leader to his death with the bribery investigation.

US Army testing gun that can take out 'bad guys' hiding around corners

The US Army is set to start testing a computerised, hightech projectile launcher that can take out bad guys hiding around corners and in caves or trenches, even if they are out of a soldier's line of sight.

Experts have called it the 'Judge Dredd" gun, after the Sylvester Stallone movie, but the Pentagon calls it the XM-25 Individual Air Burst Weapon. which uses a laser rangefinder to precisely measure the distance to a target, then primes a fuse on a timed grenade so that the projectile explodes exactly where it should.

"The way a soldier operates this is you basically find your target, then laze to it, which gives the range, then you get an adjusted aim point, adjust fire and pull the trigger," Fox News quoted deputy program manager Richard Audette as telling the Army News Service.

Huge undersea mountain found off Indonesia


A massive underwater mountain discovered off the Indonesian island of Sumatra could be a volcano with potentially catastrophic power, a scientist said yesterday.

Indonesian government marine geologist Yusuf Surachman said the mountain was discovered earlier this month about 330 kilometres (205 miles) west of Bengkulu city during research to map the seabed's seismic faultlines.

The cone-shaped moun tain is 4,600 metres (15,100 feet) high, 50 kilometres in diameter at its base and its summit is 1,300 metres below the surface, he said.

"It looks like a volcano because of its conical shape but it might not be. We have to conduct further investigations," he told AFP.
