

Costa Rica rip USA

Alvaro Saborio and Selso Borges scored early goals to give Costa Rica a 3-1 victory over the United States here on Wednesday, putting the Ticos atop North America's World Cup 2010 qualifying.

Costa Rica improved to 3-1 for nine points in the North and Central America and Caribbean region (CONCACAF) to move past the Americans, who slid to 2-1-1 for seven points to stand second in the six-nation hexagonal qualifying event.

The top three teams advance directly to the 2010 World Cup finals in South Africa. The fourth-place team must come through against the fifth-best from South America in a playoff to reach South Africa.

The Americans suffered their sixth loss in a row at Costa Rica, the longest US road losing streak to any foe, and remained winless on the artificial turf of Saprissa Stadium, known for rowdy supporters fenced off near the pitch.

The Ticos seized the lead in the opening seconds when Saborio sent the ball high and bent it around diving US goalkeeper Tim Howard.

Saborio netted the second-fastest goal ever

allowed by the US lineup in a World Cup qualifier, the only faster being a header in the first minute by Carlos Hermosillo in a 2-2 draw with Mexico from 1997.

Borges took a pass from Esteban Sirias and blasted the ball into the net in the 12th minute to double the hosts' edge.

Pablo Herrera put the finishing touches on the rout in the 68th minute as the margin matched the 3-0 drubbing suffered by the US team in 2005 in their most recent prior visit to Costa Rica.

Landon Donovan averted a shutout with a penalty kick in the second minute of stoppage time, netting the first US goal in Costa Rica since 2000 with a right-footed blast.

Adding to the Americans' woes was a yellow card on US midfielder Michael Bradley in the 55th minute, one that will keep him out Saturday against Honduras in Chicago in the next qualifying match.

US forward Brian Ching had a hamstring injury and missed the match, which was brought forward one week to allow the Americans to prepare for and play in the FIFA Confederations Cup later this month in South Africa.

Qualifying matches continue Saturday when Costa Rica will visit Trinidad and Tobago, the US squad plays host to Honduras and Mexico will travel to El Salvador.

'Kaka still Milanese'

Brazilian playmaker Kaka remains an AC Milan player, despite reports from Spain he is heading for Real Madrid in a 65-million-euro deal, Milan owner Silvio Berlusconi said Wednesday.

Spanish radio station Cadena Ser reported on Tuesday the deal had been agreed by newly-installed Real president Florentino Perez, AC Milan vice-president Adriano Galliani and Bosco Leite, Kaka's father and agent.

But Berlusconi insisted that "there is still no decision" on a definitive move and added he would be meeting with the player on Monday after the latter returns from a weekend World Cup qualifier against Uruguay.

"I will meet Kaka on Monday and then I'll tell you," Berlusconi told state broadcaster Rai.

"It is always the players who decide on their future, who have to decide how to pursue their

career," he added, noting that despite his own close relationship with Ukrainian striker Sergei Shevchenko the forward had ultimately left in 2005 to join Chelsea.

"I did all I could but in the end he took his decision," said Berlusconi, adding that he was disappointed to see that French star Yoan Gourcuff had elected to sign permanently for Bordeaux, whom he helped to the French league title while on loan from Milan.

Cadena Ser had reported Kaka would sign up for five years and a salary worth nine million euros a year, while Italian news agency Ansa Tuesday had quoted Berlusconi as coming close to admitting the star was on his way.

"I do not know if we can keep Kaka at Milan because they (Real) have offered him so much money," Ansa quoted Berlusconi as saying.

English side Chelsea, who have just landed Kaka's former boss at Milan, Carlo Ancelotti, as coach meanwhile denied reports late Wednesday that they had tabled an 85 million euro bid for the Brazilian coupled with a net annual salary of 10 million euros.

Black Cats hire Bruce

 Steve Bruce believes he can transform Sunderland into a club more familiar with the top half of the Premier League than regular relegation dogfights.

The former Manchester United defender was finally appointed as the club's new manager on Wednesday and, after signing a three-year contract, insisted he could reciprocate the success he enjoyed at Wigan.

"The aim is to take the progression forward," the 48-year-old said. "We don't want to be flirting with relegation. We want to be up where we were with Wigan."

Bruce was brought up as a fan of Sunderland's biggest rivals, Newcastle, but he does not expect that to be a barrier to him forging a bond with the Black Cats faithful.

"I think they like one of their own from the north east," Bruce said. "It's results on the pitch that matter. I hope I can win over the few doubters I have. The vast majority of what I've seen is positive."

Bruce added: "I'm proud to sit here and be Sunderland manager. Unless you're born up here, you don't really realise what it means."

"It's a working class area. It was born in me

and bred in me that I only got there with hard work. I wasn't blessed with any huge ability."

"I got there with a bit of hard graft and a bit of determination and I want my team to mirror that."

"I'm going to give everyone a chance. I've got the chance to work with the players for a good few weeks before the transfer deadline."

"Whatever happened in the past, I'm not really interested in. To start with I want to give every single one of them a chance. We have some good players here and I want to have a good look."

Bruce will be joined on Wearside by coaches Eric Black, Nigel Spink and Keith Bertschin, who have agreed to follow him from Wigan.

Chairman Niall Quinn expects Bruce to add some backbone to a team which only avoided relegation thanks to favourable results elsewhere on the final day of the season.

Japan invited to play in 2011 Copa America

Japan have been invited to play in the 2011 Copa America in Argentina, following their maiden appearance in the 1999 edition, the Japan Football Association said Thursday.

Junji Ogura, the association's vice president, learned of the invitation in Nassau, Bahamas, where he was attending the congress of football's world governing body FIFA, a spokeswoman for the FA said.

"We'll have more details when the vice president returns home," she added.

Japan competed in the South American continental championship in 1999 in Paraguay under French coach Philippe Troussier.

Middle-order batsman Sahagir Hossain hit a brilliant unbeaten century to guide Bangladesh A to a comfortable position against visiting Maharashtra Cricket Association (MCA) on the second day of their second four-day match at the Sher-e-Bangla National Stadium in Mirpur yesterday.

Resuming the day with an overnight score of 158 for 3 in 64 overs, the hosts raced to 357 before being all out in 134 overs.

Nafis Iqbal scored 81 runs off 193 balls with 12 fours while former national skipper Rajin Saleh made 34 off 88 balls with two fours and two sixes.

Right-handed Sahagir hit 102 runs off 212 balls that featured 12 fours and a six while Ziaur Rahman added 29 off 49 balls.

Ganesh Gaikwad grabbed four wickets conceding 71 runs and Kiran Yadav captured three wickets for 127 runs while Samad Fallah scalped two for 79 runs for the tourists.

In reply, MCA scored 60 in 28 overs for the loss of two wickets at stumps.

The visitors made a shaky start losing both of their openers, skipper Harshad Khadiwale (3) and Roman Bhosale (8) early as the visitors were tottering at 17 for 2 in 11.1 overs.

One down Sangram Attikar and number four Kedar Jadhav were unbeaten on 30 and 17 runs respectively.

Dollar Mahmud and Nazmul Hossain took one wicket each for three and 11 runs respectively.

Barcelona president Joan Laporta has left the door open for the departure of Samuel Eto'o, saying Wednesday that the future of the Cameroonian striker at the Spanish champions would depend on the transfer market.

"The football market is very dynamic and maybe there could be a surprise because he is a player who is very much in demand," he added.

Eto'o, the top scorer for Barcelona in the league this season with 30 goals, is under contract with the Catalan side until 2010 and "it would be great if he finished his career at Barcelona," he added.

The 28-year-old has reportedly sparked interest from English Premier League club Manchester City and French side Lyon and Italian side Inter Milan.

Catalan radio RAC1 reported Tuesday that Barcelona coach Pep Guardiola has told Eto'o that he will not be counting on him next year.
