Tax to double on big deposits

Taxes on bank deposits over Tk 10 lakh will be doubled in the next budget.

Finance ministry sources said taxes on imported powdered milk, non-essential food items, Ayurvedic medicines, refrigerator and air conditioners would be increased.

However, duties on computer, new hybrid motor vehicles, Internet and energy-saving bulbs will be brought down to zero.

The sources said tax rate for deposits of Tk 1 lakh to Tk 10 lakh would be raised to Tk 350 from the present Tk 250 while for deposits ranging from Tk 10 lakh to Tk 1 crore the tax would be increased to Tk 1,000 from Tk 500. In case of deposits from Tk 1 crore to Tk 5 crore, the tax rate

will be Tk 5,000; at present the rate is Tk 2,500. For deposits of Tk 5 crore and above the tax will be raised to Tk 10,000 from the existing Tk 5,000. The ceiling for tax-free deposit will be increased to Tk 20,000

from the present Tk 10,000, but the tax rate for deposits up to Tk 1 lakh will remain unchanged at Tk 120. A proposal has been placed for increasing the supplementary

duty on different types of vehicles up to 150 percent, but the duty on new hybrid cars will remain at zero, sources said. The present 3 percent supplementary duty on importing


The next fiscal year might prove a tough one for the country's economy as economic growth in 2008-09 fiscal year dipped to 5.88 percent from the previous year's 6.2 percent with the decline in output of manufacturing and services sec-


Following the impact of the global recession, the turnover in the industry sector in the outgoing fiscal year dipped by 0.9 percentage point to

5.9 percent from the previous year's 6.8 percent. Growth in the services sector, which accounts for half of the country's gross domestic product (GDP) worth about \$80 billion, fell to 6.3 percent this year from 6.5 percent of the previous year.


Bangladesh recorded a GDP growth of 6 percent or more for the last four consecutive years till 2007-08 with a steady rise in industry, services, exports and remittances.
