Syndicate of 50 claims land in Atir Khal, set to fill it up, sell as plots

Defying the wetland protection act and a prime ministerial order, a real estate developer has embarked on a project to fill up Atir Khal, one of the busiest canals till today, connected with the river Buriganga, and serving thousands of farmers, traders, and commuters of at least a dozen places of Keraniganj.

Waaspur Garden City, a syndicate of about 50 individuals, has now demarcated the canal that also

includes an area below a 300 feet long bridge connecting Looter Char with Ghater Char.

According to local residents, each member of the syndicate paid Tk 5 lakh to form the company, which 'owns' some land there. Health sector jobs grossly politicised

Transfers, promotions dictated by pro-AL doctors' body

Massive transfers and promotions in the country's health sector have given rise to strong allegations that politicisation of the health sector is in full swing.

It is alleged that only Awami Leagueaffiliated doctors are being given lucrative posts while skilled doctors are being removed from responsible posts or transferred to remote regions because of their

affiliation with other political parties.

Experts and observers say leaders of Swadhinata Chikitshak Parishad (SCP)--a pro-AL doctors' wing--is going down the same path of oppression and manipulation followed by the pro-BNP doctors' wing Doctors' Association of Bangladesh (DAB) during the tenure of the last political government.

Leaders of SCP are said to be creating pressure on the government for undue

advantages.

Many are also pointing at Health Minister AFM Ruhul Haque, who is the present president of SCP, as the person pulling strings in the organisation's favour.

A huge round of transfers and promotions has taken place at hospitals, medical colleges and other medical institutions. More than 800 supporters of the pro-BNP DAB have been transferred SEE PAGE 7 COL 1

EVICTION ON TURAG, CANAL

More structures knocked down

As part of the ongoing eviction drive Bangladesh Inland Water Transport Authority (BIWTA) and Dhaka district adminstartion yesterday knocked down five more structures illegally built on the river Turag.

Meanwhile, Dhaka Water Supply and Sewerage Authority (Wasa) yesterday demolished 10 structures constructed illegally on the Katashur canal as part of its canal recovery drive.

Yesterday's drive was conducted on the Dhaka end of the river Turag where a total of 69 large factories and makeshift structures were built on the river.

The eviction team led by Executive Magistrate Muhammad Mokbul Hossain pulled down structures built illegally by Monjil Paribahan Private Limited and Uttara Homeopathy Hospital by the Ashulia road at Ranabhola at 11:00 a.m.

Three such sheds of a wholesale fish market to the west of Tongi Bridge and two makeshift structures adjacent to Baitun Noor Jame Masjid were also dismantled.

"We spared the mosque as it is a matter of religious sensitivity," said BIWTA Deputy Director Saiful Islam.

BIWTA was supposed to resume demolition of the Bengal Indigo textile factory but it was postponed as the factory owner SEE PAGE 15 COL 6
