## Govt footing eviction bill?

The government is spending huge amount from the public exchequer for its ongoing drive against river grabbers, although there is a legal option for realising the cost from the demolished property of the encroachers.

Director (Port Division) of Bangladesh Inland Water Transport Authority (BIWTA) Mahabubul Alam said they have never received any compensation for demolition costs.

BIWTA Deputy Director Saiful Islam said the deputy commissioners (DC) concerned are responsible for realising the demolition costs from the encroachers.

"I believe the offenders should pay the demolition costs, but it's not in practice and as far as I can remember there is no specific law to realise the costs from them," said DC of Narayanganj Md Shamsur Rahman.

Eviction is carried out under the Eviction Ordinance (Presidential Order), 1973 that provides that demolition costs may be exacted by auctioning the demolished property, said Rahman.

"But it is not practically viable. If we intend to realise the expenses under the Public Demand Recovery Act, there has to be a designated authority to declare it," he added.

Eminent lawyer Dr Shahdeeb Malik said those who have grabbed khas land and erected illegal structures must be made liable for the demolition expenses.

The government should also take appropriate measures to extract the expenses from the offenders, he added.

Prof Mizanur Rahman of law department of Dhaka University said even if there is no specific law in this regard, the offenders must be made to pay the demolition cost as per the spirit of the jurisprudence.

Deputy Director Saiful Islam said BIWTA had to spend Tk 1 lakh on average every day during the nine-day drive in the Turag.

Flour mills,  
warehouses  
demolished

Seven new structures illegally built on the Shitalakhyা were partially demolished yesterday as part of the ongoing drive against encroachments on the river conducted by Bangladesh Inland Water Transport Authority (BIWTA) along with Narayanganj district administration.

The structures located near Nitaiganj ferry terminal included four flour mills and warehouses, two houses and a rice mill. They were one to three-storey concrete and semi-concrete structures.

Officials involved in the drive said they faced a tricky situation regarding an adjacent six-storey structure -- Chand Flour Mills -- as the encroachment marking was altered, and its influential owner is lobbying for evading the eviction drive.

Executive Magistrate Abul Kashem led the sixth-day drive yesterday while BIWTA Senior Deputy Director Md Abu Zafar Hawlader, deputy

# JS to get update after 6 months

Treasury bench MPs criticise CG

Finance Minister AMA Muhith yesterday said he would inform the House after six months about progress in budget implementation in the upcoming fiscal year.

His announcement followed some lawmakers' criticism of the supplementary budget for FY 2008-09.

The caretaker government drew up the financial plan and was in power for half the current fiscal year.

Muhith said he had placed the supplementary budget in parliament as per the constitution, and that it does not need to be sent to the parliamentary standing committee on the finance ministry for scrutiny.

The legislature may pass the add-on budget today.

In a brief statement, the finance minister said the country's foreign currency reserves totalled \$7 billion yesterday.

Participating in discussion on the budget for the ongoing fiscal year, Awami League-led ruling alliance lawmakers blasted the caretaker government for 'undemocratic rule'.

AL presidium member Suranjit Sengupta proposed doing away with the interim government system, and said the parliamentary election should be held under supervision of the Election Commission.

"In his budget speech, the finance minister did not say much about the caretaker rule -- how they nearly destroyed the country. We hope he [Muhith] will speak for scrapping the caretaker system."

# BTMA favours selected sectors

Leaders of Bangladesh Textile Mills Association (BTMA) yesterday criticised the national budget for 2009-10 fiscal year for the provision of legalising undisclosed money in all sectors against 10 percent tax.

The textile millers prefer some selected sectors like industry and stock market to be allowed to whiten money as the investment of undisclosed money in unproductive sectors like real estate would not generate employment, said BTMA President Abdul Hai Sarker at a press conference at the association office in the city.

"We know the government proposed to allow legalising black money to generate employment so that it [government] can counteract the bad impact of global recession, but allowing it in such a flat fashion would not bring the expected result as most of the black money owners would invest the money in unproductive sectors," Sarker said.

Generally, black money comprises around one-third of GDP in any economy. Black Money means income, as from illegal activities, that is not reported to the government for tax

## Unite against Tipai dam Seminar urges all

Bangladesh Paribesh Andolan (Bapa) President Prof Muzaffar Ahmad yesterday called on the government "not to kill people" by allowing India to build Tipaimukh dam and thus cause a drought in Bangladesh.

He said the Tipaimukh dam is not an issue to be used politically, and called on everyone to stand united against the dam to save the country from "turning into a stretch of desert."

Speaking at a seminar on Tipaimukh Dam at the Jatiya Press Club yesterday morning, Prof Muzaffar also said lawmakers and ministers should step down if they fail to stop India from constructing the dam.

The ecological balance of the country would be further threatened and water resources destroyed if the dam is built, he said.

Defeated Iranian presidential candidate Mir Hossein Mousavi appeared in public on Monday for the first time since the election that has divided the nation, joining thousands of supporters who defied a ban to stage a mass rally in Tehran.

Mousavi turned up in a car at the opposition march to protest at what the moderate wartime premier has branded a rigged "charade," on the third day of public demonstrations following President Mahmoud Ahmadinejad's landslide win.

"Mousavi we support you! We will die but retrieve our votes!" shouted the crowds of thousands, young and old, who poured
