The parliamentary standing committee on water resources ministry yesterday formed a nine-member team comprised of lawmakers and experts to visit the Tipaimukh dam area to assess its impact on Bangladesh.

Three workers were killed and 15 others injured as a bizde factory caught fire after a gas cylinder explosion at Masimpur in Tongi Industrial area of Gazipur early yesterday.

Witnesses said a gas cylinder exploded on the ground floor of the two-storey Bidyut Bangladesh Pvt Ltd with a big bang around 12:30am.

They said the fire spread to the storeroom on the first floor and all other units of the factory following the explosion, damaging machineries, blades and raw materials and killing the workers.

The deceased were identified as Shahidul Islam, 27, son of Chan Miah of Ghor Chotraipur village in Sonatola of Bogra, Delwar Hossain, 26, son of Hatem Sheikh of Havetpur village in Gobindaganj of Gaibandha, and Sanjay Dutta, 25, son of Sunil Kar of Haldev Miah village in Mongla of Bagerhat.

The injured were taken to Tongi Upazila Health Complex and Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH) for treatment. The condition of one worker is very critical at DMCH, sources said.

Says Muhith on money-whitening

UNB, Dhaka

Finance Minister AMA Muhith yesterday said the black money holders will in no way be asked any question about the source of money they would invest under the amnesty proposed in the new budget. "If we ask question about the source of money, the purpose of

the amnesty will not be successful," he told reporters in response to a question whether criminal investigations would be launched against the black money holders later on if they show the hidden money. There is a misunderstanding that the money would be whit-

ened in the last year of the three-year amnesty, Muhith said. He made it clear that black money should come in the first year of the amnesty period as the expected huge money cannot be invested in a single year. The minister was talking to the reporters after meeting with

visiting International Finance Corporation (IFC) Director Pierre Guislain at the Economic Relations Division when they discussed how the IFC could help Bangladesh improve the investment climate following the major budgetary measures.

There is widespread apprehension among cross-sections of society lest there should be investigation into the source of money of the investors once they are identified as black money holders.

A senior lawyer who is now in government told UNB, "It would be clear after issuance of the SRO in this regard."

A relative of an 'encounter' victim has filed a murder case against 10 personnel of the Rapid Action Battalion.

Budget proposal Climate fund to get \$150m from UK Minister tells JS; also reveals measures to check river pollution, encroachment

The UK government has pledged to commit around \$150 million to the Multi-Donor Trust Fund to be formed by Bangladesh to cope with the climate change.

Speaking in parliament, State Minister for Environment and Forest Mostafizur Rahman said formation of the fund is now at the final stage with donor agencies and countries promising the government necessary financial assistance.

He said Bangladesh has taken various measures to be on guard

against threats posed by global warm-

ing and rising sea levels. It has already proposed to set aside Tk 700 crore for the fund to begin adaptation to the possible changes in envi-

ronment, the state minister added. "We look to complete the formation of the climate change fund by June," he said in a scripted answer to a query from ruling Awami League lawmaker Tohura Ali.

Earlier on June 10, Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina told parliament the country will be able to pool the resources it needs to tackle the impacts of global warming.
