Call to enact law to free admin Abducted child rescued after 19 days

After 19 days of abduction of three-and-a-half-year-old child Elizabeth alias Buri from the city's Gulshan, detectives rescued the girl from suburban Tongi area on Thursday

Detective Branch (DB) police also arrested three people -- Hunafa Akhter, 25, Panchu Sheikh, 50, and headded. Aminul Islam -- who demanded Tk 50 lakh as ransom from the victim's father Mirza Rezaul Alam.

After Buri was kidnapped on May 31, her father filed a case with Gulshan Police Station accusing Aminul of abducting her daughter.

DB sources said they had first arrested Aminul from Hethalia village under Bhandaria upazila in Pirojpur.

Following his confession, the DB police nabbed two others and later rescued the girl from Arichpur in Tongi.

The child has been handed over to her parents.



Khan's secretary in Kolkata Ashish Roy said the maestro, who was on dialysis, had been ailing for over four years and his condition had deteriorated in the last four months.

A recipient of Padma Bhushan and Padma Vibhushan, Khan was a colossus in the world of Indian classical music for the last five decades.

One of the most accomplished of Indian musicians in the Classical tradition, Ustad Ali Akbar Khan has been designated a 'Living National Treasure' in India-not to mention the fact that he is the object of much admiration in the rest of the world for his

absolute mastery of the 25- Indian musician to receive the stringed sarod.

Menuhin as 'the greatest musician in the world', Sarod maestro Ali Akbar Khan had many a first to his credit in taking Indian classical music to the

88-year-old Khan, who had settled down in San Francisco in the US, was admired by both Eastern as well as Western musicians for his brilliant compositions and his mastery of the 25-string instrument The illustrious son of Ustad Alauddin Khan, he was once described by Menuhin as 'the

greatest musician in the world' Khan was the first to cut a long player record of Indian classical music in the US and to give a sarod recital on American TV. Khan was also the first

MacArthur Foundation Hailed by violinist Yehudi Fellowship in 1991 and was nominated for Grammy Awards five times between 1970 to 1998. Born on April 14, 1922 in Shibpur village of Comilla district, now in Bangladesh, Khan took up music at the age of three, learning vocal music from his father and percussion from his uncle, Fakir Aftabuddin. His father also trained him in several other instruments, but Khan decided to concentrate on the sarodand on vocals. A recipient of Padma Vibhushan and Padma Bhushan, Khan gave his first public performance in Allahabad at the age 13 and made his first gramophone
