

Govt goes for more dredger purchase

Tender soon for three; 17 more to be procured in phases to dredge rivers

The government is going to procure three dredgers at a cost of Tk 105 crore as part of its

Sources said the government will soon invite tender to procure three modern hydraulic dredgers. Seventeen more dredgers will be procured in phases.

"We will invite an open tender by next month for the procurement," said Nur-e-Alam Chowdhury, chairman of parliamentary standing committee on shipping ministry, while talking to The Daily Star.

The process of procuring 14 out of 17 dredgers has also been initiated, he said, adding that the approval from the Planning Commission may take three months before going for tender. The government has not purchased any

dredger after 1975. Most of the rivers of the country have lost navigability due to encroachment and long-

stalled dredging programmes, experts said. The rivers surrounding Dhaka and those still used as the routes of country's river communications will get priority for dredging, said

Bangladesh Inland Water Transport recently conceived ambitious plan for river Authority (BIWTA) Chairman Md Abdul Mannan Howlader said that BIWTA is working on the schedule for re-tender to procure one dredger from the government's own fund.

> Besides, Japan Debt Cancellation Fund (JDCF) has granted Tk 170 crore to procure two more dredgers. Some ancillary equipment like tugboats would be procured from the JDCF

> It will take at least two years from now to procure the three dredgers. Those are likely to the purchased from the Netherlands. The existing seven dredgers were also brought from the same country.

> The shipping ministry has already placed a draft project pro forma to the Economic Relations Division (ERD) for procurement of 17 more dredgers, sources said.

BIWTA has a fleet of only seven dredgers to excavate 6,000 kms of river route in the country SEE PAGE 15 COL 3

Former adviser to caretaker government barrister Mainul Hosein yesterday binned a parliamentary standing committee's allegation that he had allocated plots abusing power.

"The allegations lodged against me are false, baseless and motivated. No plot was allotted during the tenure of the last caretaker government," he said, while briefing newsmen at his Baridhara residence.

A five-member subcommittee was formed on Thursday to investigate alleged corruption of Mainul.

Taxes on mobile, SIM should go

Economists, experts tell seminar

Imposing taxes on mobile phone sets and SIM cards will create impediments to fast expansion of information technology at a time when the government is trying to build a Digital Bangladesh, economists and information technology experts said yesterday.

They recommended withdrawing the 25 percent tax on mobile phone sets above a certain price and 15 percent VAT on Internet use so that a possible digital divide can be averted.

Imposing more taxes will increase smuggling of mobile phone sets while flawed policies might create a digital divide, observed the speakers at a seminar styled "Contribution of the proposed budget in building digital Bangladesh: the problems UK Minister for Security and and gaps" organised by Dhansiri Media Production House at

> Finance Minister AMA Muhith assured the speakers of conidering their demands and recommendations.

"Imposing 25 percent tax on mobile phone sets is suicidal," said Debapriya Bhattacharya, fellow of Centre for Policy Dialogue.

BOGRA AMMO HAUL Trial stalled for over 4yrs

Trials of four cases filed in connection with the recovery of one truckload of bullets in Kahalu upazila of Bogra on June 27, 2003 remains stalled for about four and a half years.

A court had halted proceedings of the cases following an appeal by an accused.

Police also failed to find out all the persons who were behind the smuggling of the ammunition as the investigation into the cases were also suspended.

Police seized a truck loaded with 99,967 bullets of Chinese rifles and 174kg of explosives on the night of June 27, 2003. The truck was loaded from

Bogra plant still waits for equipment supply

One year passes after deadline

Power generation from 20-megawatt (MW) rental power plant in Bogra has become uncertain due to lack of required equipment.

Sources said private company Energy Prima Ltd, Dhaka started work of the power plant in February 2008 aiming at supplying power to the national grid by May the same year but it is yet to complete assembling of equipment in the

Moazzem Hossain, chairman of Energy Prima Ltd, told this correspondent that the company management has decided to start power generation by next August although German company "Power International AG" is yet to supply all equipment as per the contract.

"According to the contract, the German company has to supply six engines and other equipment for the power plant. But it supplied five engines without required equipment," he said.

A senior official of Energy Prima Ltd, sister concern of Hosaf Group, said that a case was filed with the High Court against the German company in February this year to stop payment of US\$ 3.59 million for violating the contract.

Another case will be filed this week with a court in Singapore against the German company on charge of cheating, said the official. A discussion was held between the legal advisers of both the companies in Singapore a few days ago to solve the problem.

Watchdog trashes Iran polls dispute, terms it 'cleanest'

Defiant opposition to keep up protest despite pressure

Iran's electoral watchdog insisted yesterday that this month's disputed presidential vote was the cleanest ever, rejecting opposition allegations of fraud that have brought hundreds of thousands onto the streets.

"After 10 days of examination, we did not see any major irregularities," Guardians Council spokesman Abbasali Kadkhodai told the official IRNA news agency.

"We have had no fraud in any presidential election and this one was the cleanest election we have had. I can say with cer-

tainty that there was no fraud in this election." The council is expected to give its final ruling on Monday after supreme leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei gave it an additional five days to investigate complaints filed by the defeated
