Establish expat welfare bank for NRBs

Speakers urge govt

Speakers at a seminar yesterday stressed the need to establish an expatriate welfare bank to help the Non-Resident Bangladeshis (NRBs) living and working abroad in sending remittance to the country through formal channels.

They sought for a quick implementation of the government's decision to establish such a bank that was announced by the finance minister in his sector."

budget speech. "An expatriate welfare bank is an emergency, as the government needs to support the migrant workers in sending remittance through formal channels," said Prof MM Akash, a noted econo-

"Along with sending money through formal channels, such a bank would also help them in getting bank loan in advance that they can be utilised for developing new business ventures," headded.

He was speaking at the seminar on 'Providing bank loans, saving plans and policies to Bangladeshi migrant workers' jointly organised by Scholars Bangladesh and Human Capital Development Ltd at a city hotel.

Prof Akash said the bank would also help the migrant workers save money for their future.

The government has declared to establish an expatriate welfare bank with expatriate workers as its shareholders and investors in a bid to help those seeking jobs abroad and using remittance for productive purposes in the current fiscal.

The government high-ups, including the prime minister, have already agreed on the move. The expatriate welfare ministry, finance ministry and Bangladesh Bank (BB) has started working to complete all necessary formalities, including formulation of a legal framework, to set up the

AHM Mostafa Kamal, chairman of the parliamentary standing committee on finance ministry, branded the NRBs as the pride of the country.

"We don't need to open any letter of credit (LC) to receive billion dollars remittance. But still manpower sector is most neglected," he said, adding: "It is very unfortunate for the nation. But we still have good prospect in this neglected

He said, "Most of the migrant workers go abroad after selling their personal belongings. But when they return they can't afford to repurchase

"The prime minister is aware of it. So, the proposal of setting up a separate bank has been placed which will develop products exclusively

In his keynote paper, Dr Towfique Ahmmed Chowdhury, underscored the importance of initiating an inclusive measure so that nonresident workers can send their remittance

through formal channels. He also urged the government to maintain a close network between the BB and other microfinance institutions (MFIs) to help the families of migrant worker get the money safely and on time.

In another keynote, Syeda Farzana Morshed, CEO of Centre for Development and Competitive Strategies, said the government should take necessary measures to encourage female migrant workers to get involved in entrepreneurship after returninghome.

She said 69 percent of the female workers have failed to maintain their economic progress after they return home.

Dr Mohammed Farashuddin, former BB governor, and Iqbal U Ahmed, managing director of Trust Bank Ltd, also spoke at the seminar.

Fate of Benarasi Estate still hangs in balance

Land allocated 25 years ago

Benarasi saree weavers at Mirpur in the capital are passing a miserable life as the future of proposed Benarasi Estate at Bhashantek is hanging in balance even 25 years after the land allocation by the government.

Having no land of their own, the weavers are passing their days in fear of fresh eviction as the entire business grew up on publicland.

The business of traditional Benarasi sarees is also witnessing a rapid slump with imported and smuggled Indian sarees taking over the local market making hundreds of weavers

Industry insiders said the government in 1984 allocated around 40 acres of land at Bhashantek to set up an estate for Benarasi weavers entrusting the Bangladesh Handloom Board with the project.

The Tk 294.66 million project has plans to establish handloom factories, washing and dyeing units, housing and other basic amenities for weav-

Under the project which went on at a sloth's pace from the beginning, there is a plan for settingup 906 plots.

Applications were invited from weavers in 2003. Around 1865 weavers submitted applications along with Tk 10,000 in the form of bank draft for each Since then there have been

no progress while the land remains occupied by slum dwellers. Meanwhile, some of the

weavers who submitted the bank draft have passed away and many withdrew their

weavers are now working as "Weavers are facing enormous hardships as there is no permanent place for them to

of the sarees showcased in stores are Indian products. In many cases Indian designs are being reproduced here with raw materials coming from India," said Jainal Abedin Babu, another veteran in the industry. "Local craftsmen fail to

compete as they are discouraged to continue the profession for lack of social and financial security," he added.

Mohammad Babu, a weaver from Mirpur 10, said prices of raw silk and golden thread (jari)

are increasing continuously. "The profit is so meagre compared to excruciating

labour, lengthy production time and enormous investment that it is no longer cost-effective," added Babu who does not want his son to learn the trade.

MdTaherul Islam, director of Benarasi Palli Project, said about 85 percent of land development work and 20 percent of boundary wall of the proposed estate have so far been completed.

"We could not continue our work due to a stay order issued by the High Court (HC), " he added.

In 2003 Bangladesh Legal Aid and Services Trust (BLAST) filed a writ petition with the HC against the eviction of slum dwellers.

The HC in March 2004 issued a stay order saying that the slum dwellers cannot be evicted unless the petition reaches a verdict.


