

India closely monitoring Saeed case
Says Krishna

External Affairs Minister SM Krishna has said that New Delhi is closely monitoring the case of Jamaat-ud-Dawa (JuD) chief Hafeez Muhammad Saeed, the prime accused of the November 2008 Mumbai attacks.

"I think that it is the internal matter of Pakistan, especially when courts are involved. We do not comment on those developments. But, we are closely monitoring the events in Pakistan," Krishna said.

Pakistan lodged appeals on Monday against a court decision to release Saeed.

Kashmir unable to tackle insurgency alone

Says chief minister

Indian Kashmir's chief minister warned yesterday against any large-scale pull-out of paramilitary forces, saying the police force alone could not cope with the Muslim insurgency in the region.

Omar Abdullah's comments came almost a month after New Delhi promised to phase out the presence of large numbers of paramilitary troopers in towns across Muslim-majority Kashmir.

The chief minister argued that any major redeployment of the paramilitary Central

Reserve Police Force (CRPF) had to be very carefully planned.

"We have over 70 battalions (70,000 personnel) of the CRPF and the state police's strength is not even one-third of that," the Press Trust of India quoted Abdullah as saying.

New Delhi has not disclosed any timetable for a possible redeployment of troops, or the numbers involved.

The insurgency against Indian rule in Kashmir has left more than 47,000 people dead by official count since 1989. New Delhi has long accused Pakistan of arming and funding the rebels. Islamabad denies the charge.

Ulfa hit-squad enters Assam from Myanmar

The outlawed United Liberation Front of Assam (ULFA) is planning to stage violent strikes in the run up to Independence Day, with a four-member hit squad sneaking into the state from bases in Myanmar, rebel leaders said yesterday.

"We have information of at least four ULFA militants, including a senior leader, already entering Assam from Myanmar and planning to carry out attacks ahead of Aug 15. Prabal Neog, leader of the pro-talk ULFA faction, told IANS.

Neog is among 150 odd militants of the Alpha and Charlie companies of ULFA's 28th battalion that

entered into a ceasefire with government last year. The 28th battalion is the most potent striking unit of the ULFA.

"According to our information, the ULFA group is planning to attack security forces by triggering landmines, blow up oil installations and pipelines, besides trying to target some of our leaders (pro-talk ULFA)," said Neog, who was earlier a commander of the 28th battalion.

Security forces, meanwhile, stepped up patrol in vulnerable areas in eastern Assam's Tinsukia and Dibrugarh districts following the inputs provided by the pro-talk ULFA leaders about possible attacks by ULFA militants ahead of Independence Day.

Indonesians vote today to elect president

Indonesia votes Wednesday in only its second direct presidential election since the fall of the Suharto dictatorship, with incumbent Susilo Bambang Yudhoyono expected to win another five-year term.

The liberal ex-general is hoping to avoid a run-off in September by beating opposition leader Megawati Sukarnoputri and outgoing Vice President Jusuf Kalla with a clear majority in the first round.

Most opinion polls indicate he has enough support to avoid a run-off, although some have pointed to a much closer race with Yudhoyono facing either Megawati or Kalla in a second-round decider.

Over 4 lakh displaced by Assam floods

Over 4 lakh people have been displaced in floods triggered by heavy rainfall in Assam.

The flood situation in Assam is critical with the Brahmaputra river and its tributaries flowing above the dangermark.

Flooding in the past one week has marooned more than 500 villages in the four upper Assam districts of Lakhimpur, Dhemaji, Jorhat and Naogaon.

Central Assam's Morigaon, lower Assam's Barpeta, Guwahati (Kamrup district), Bongaigaon, Dhubri and Baksa have also been affected by floods.

Personnel of the National Disaster Response Force have been engaged in rescue operations.

US Marines clearing out key Afghan insurgent centres

Nearly a week after launching one of the biggest operations in post-Taliban Afghanistan, about 4,000 US Marines are holding key insurgent centres and making it clear they intend to stay, the forces say.

The Marines, working with around 600 Afghan security forces, have pushed far down the Helmand River valley, setting up in the key towns of Nawa and Garmisir and wresting control of Khanishin in the far south towards Pakistan.

They were clearing out areas around these points and meeting locals to explain their purpose, officials said.

Nawa and Garmisir had previously had some government presence. But the arrival of around 500 Marines had helped police restore govern-

ment control in Khanishin, a statement from the Marine Expeditionary Brigade said late Monday.

The extremist Taliban, which ran Afghanistan from 1996 to 2001, had established a proxy administration in the area, an important stopping point in a route through the desert from the largely open border.

"This is the first time coalition forces have had a sustained presence so far south in the Helmand River valley," the statement said.

"Khanishin had been a Taliban stronghold for several years before Afghan and coalition forces arrived and began discussions with local leaders several days ago," it said.

Afghan officials reported earlier that the force had moved into the area easily on Thursday, hours after Operation Khanjar (dagger) was launched with relays of choppers dropping hundreds of troops into Taliban territory.

6 killed in Philippines bomb attacks

At least six people were killed and more than 40 wounded by twin bomb blasts in the Philippines Tuesday, in what officials described as coordinated attacks by al-Qaeda-linked militants.

The first bomb exploded in a commercial area on Jolo island, killing six people and wounding around 30, police said. It was followed around two hours later by a car bomb blast next to a parked military patrol jeep in Iligan city.

The second blast wounded at least 10 people, including three soldiers, the military said.

Jolo, in the southern Philippines, is a stronghold of Abu Sayyaf Muslim rebels and local anti-terror task force chief Major General Juancho Sabban was quick to point the finger at the militants.
