## BANGABANDHU MURDER CASE Govt preparing for SC hearing

The Attorney General's (AG) Office has taken preparations for hearing of the long-pending Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman assassination case as the government is going to appoint four judges to the Appellate Division.

Earlier on Sunday, Attorney General Mahbubey Alam told The Daily Star his office is prepared for hearing of the appeals filed by five condemned prisoners against the verdict in the case.

"We'll place arguments on behalf of the state when the hearing of the case starts at the Appellate Division," he said. The hearing will start when the chief justice constitutes a bench of the apex court, he added.

Law Minister Shafique Ahmed on Sunday told The Daily Star the government has requested Chief Justice MM Ruhul Amin to send names of eight High Court judges to the president for four of them to get appointed to the Appellate Division.

"The posts for four new Appellate Division judges have already been created and I hope the appointments will be made

## 2 fake mineral water plants sealed off

A combined team of BSTI and Rapid Action Battalion (Rab) personnel yesterday sealed off two fraudulent water treatment and filtration plants in the city's Karwan Bazar and Uttara and held eight people in this connection.

Prosecuting officer of Bangladesh Standards and Testing Institution (BSTI) SM Abu Sayeed said during a raid around 2:30pm they found the water plant at Food and Beverage factory in Karwan Bazar out of order.

The workers were refilling jars directly with supply water of Dhaka Water Supply and Sewerage Authority (Wasa), he added.

The team seized 110 jars, arrested its owner Abul Masud Kajol and sealed off the

## BIWTA proposes mega project to protect rivers

Drive against Buriganga encroachment starts in end-July

Bangladesh Inland Water Transport Authority (BIWTA) has proposed an embankment project to protect the rivers surrounding the capital from encroachment and to sustain the drive against river encroachers.

"I have already sent a proposal to the shipping ministry to undertake a project by the Water Development Board under water resources ministry," said BIWTA Chairman Md Abdul Mannan Howlader.

They will also send another proposal for constructing walkway, landing and other facilities, and taking tree plantation programme along the riverbanks.

"We hope to send a Tk 100 crore draft project pro forma to the ministry by this week," said Howlader.

Meanwhile, the anti-encroachment drive got delayed, as the BIWTA officials have been engrossed in leasing out the passenger and

cargo landing stations for the last three weeks. BIWTA officials said that they would start eviction drive against the encroachers of Buriganga by the end of July.

"We have identified 113 encroachers of the Buriganga and it will take a couple of days to finalise the list," said BIWTA Deputy Director Saiful Islam.

The list will include around 150 illegal structures and encroachments on Buriganga, said Islam.

The rivers Buriganga, Turag, Balu and Shitalakhya span around 110 kilometres of the capital city.

Of the total length, at least 50 to 60 kilometres have to be demarcated with embankment and walkways to protect the river from encroachment, said Howlader while talking to The Daily Star.

A total of 35 kilometres of riverbanks surrounding Dhaka should have walkways as

## Uncertainty over BNP's upazila unit formation

Most dist committees still  
wait for approval

BNP could not start forming its upazila level committees as most of the district convening committees, which have been assigned to suggest the names of members to form upazila units by tomorrow, are still awaiting central committee's approval.

The delay in finalisation of the conflict-ridden district committees has made formation of upazila committees uncertain.

Every district committee is supposed to send a 31-member convening committee for each upazila level unit but no district committee has sent the names, party sources said.

BNP's central committee has so far approved only 20 district committees out of 71 to be tasked with naming full convening committees as part of party restructuring. The party on June 9 announced 71 committees out of 75 organisational districts in a bid to reorganise it from grassroots level.

## Swat refugees head home

15 killed in explosion  
in Pak village

Hundreds of Pakistanis who fled a military offensive against the Taliban in Swat Valley began trickling back home yesterday, but many families refused to leave refugee camps, demanding promised government assistance and citing security concerns.

In Pakistan's east, meanwhile, an explosion rocked a small village, killing at least 15 people seven of them children wounding dozens and damaging tens of houses in a reminder that security in the country has deteriorated well beyond the north

## Lax security led to BTCL siege

Says probe body report

The three-member probe committee on Habiganj BTCL office siege on July 8 submitted on Sunday its report to the deputy commissioner, making nine recommendations in a bid to strengthen security to the office.

Insufficient security measures and negligence of the officials concerned at Bangladesh Telecommunications Company Ltd (BTCL) office in Habiganj helped much in the incident and suspected militant Shahin took advantage of the poor security arrangement, the report said.

The committee was formed the next day of the incident and it was asked to submit its report on security arrangement of the building and reasons for the incident within three days.

Sources said head of the probe committee Additional District Magistrate Md Nurunnabi and ASP Mohammad Ullah, a member of the body, submitted the report to the deputy commissioner. The third member of the committee BTCL Divisional Engineer Binoy Krishna Gain, however, did not cooperate in preparing the report.

The chief of the committee said submission of the report was delayed due to the non-cooperation of the divisional engineer.

The report mentioned that on that particular day the main


## FIRST TEST UPDATE
