Huji managed even a charity licence

Target was to ensure foreign funding for militancy



Banned Islamist outfit Harkat-ul-Jihad-al Islami set up a charity called Faruqi Welfare Foundation last year to use it as a cover for receiving funds from abroad.

The foundation however could not be in operation as it came under intelligence watch a few days after obtaining the certificate from the Registrar of Joint Stock Companies and Firms (RJSC) on June 29 that year.

Intelligence officials say the militants founded the charity to secure funds through a way around tight measures against terror financinginthepost-9/11 years.

They observe the Huji leaders are desperate for funds as they need the money to have a vast network of qawmi



madrasas and fresh recruits for "jihad".

On paper, Faruqi Welfare Foundation's objectives however are building mosques, madrasas, orphanages and Islamic research centres and facilitating religious education.

Already struggling to start functioning, the foundation suffered another

blow after its Chairman Sheikh Abdus Salam was arrested on March 23 for suspected links to the CPB rally blast that killed five people at Paltan Maidan on January 20, 2001.

Salam, former Huji boss and an Afghan war veteran, is also convenor of Islamic Democratic Party (IDP), a political party floated in May last year on permission from the caretaker administration.

Kazi Azizul Huq, an adviser to IDP, which failed to get registered with the Election Commission, is a vicechairman of the foundation.

Mohammad Lokman, another member of IDP, is secretary, while Salam's family members make up the rest of the nine-member executive council.

Clouds over fate of 60,000 rural poor

Govt decides not to extend leases of over 800 water bodies to a Grameen subsidiary

A government decision of not extending leases of over 800 water bodies to a Grameen Bank subsidiary put livelihoods of over 60,000 rural poor in jeopardy.

Grameen Motsho O Pashusampad Foundation (GMPF), which transformed hundreds of derelict ponds into viable fisheries and created jobs for thousands of rural poor over the last two decades, is now losing grounds because of the government's sudden policy shift on leasing out the previously neglected water bodies.

Grameen Bank took lease of 875 derelict ponds with an area of over 6,500 bighas of land in different upazilas of Dinajpur, Thakurgaon, Panchagarh, Nilphamari, Bogra, Sirajganj and Pabna districts through four agreements signed with the government between 1986 and

By forming the non-profit entity GMPF, Grameen Bank eventually cleaned and developed those ponds and their vicinities, formed groups from among the poor and engaged them in various income generating activities including fish cultivation, dairy, livestock and poultry farming, duckery, cattle fattening, horticulture and homestead gardening.

But two decades down the line as the leases are expiring one after another, the government is denying the Grameen venture any further extension of leases on the pretext that the ministry and departments concerned would take up those water bodies for productive activities through community-based organisa-

tions (CBOs). Under the four agreements, the GMPF took lease of the derelict ponds for four projects --Joysagar Fish Farm (JFF), Dinajpur Fish Farm (DFF), Nandigram Special Fish Project (NSFP) SEE PAGE 12 COL 1

Jobs for 2,000 youths in Barguna, Kurigram

Tk 100 a day during training, Tk 200 when employed proposed for National Service programme

The government would provide employment to around 2,000 HSC-passed unemployed youths in two most povertyridden districts during the current fiscal year under the newly introduced 'National Service' programme.

Sources in the youth and sports ministry said the youths would receive daily

allowance of Tk 100 during a three-month training period. After completion of the training, the youths may be given Tk 200 per day as salary when they are given job.

According to a government concept paper, a total of 1.39 lakh HSC and equivalent examination passed youths are currently unemployed throughout the country.

Based on the concept paper of the

finance ministry, the youth and sports ministry has been processing a proposal for finalisation of the National Service.

Sources said the proposal would very soon be sent to the cabinet for approval. Finance Minister AMA Muhith in his

budget speech said for the time being the work would start in Barguna and Kurigram districts as a pilot project. He SEE PAGE 15 COL 4

AL goes to council, Hasina wants ignores charter

The ruling Awami League is violating its own constitution by keeping General Secretary Abdul Jalil aloof from the process of holding its July 24 national council, which has sparked strong criticism among many party leaders.

The AL constitution empowers its general secretary to convene the party's national council upon orders or approval of the party president.

Abdul Jalil was elected the AL general secretary at the party's last council held on December 26, 2002.

However, Jalil was not allowed to discharge his duties regarding the upcoming national council, which has clearly frustrated the veteran politician, and a number of leaders close to Jalil said he might resign as general secretary ahead of the long due event.

A number of senior AL leaders even predict that Jalil might not be allowed to place the report of the general secretary at the council.

The general secretary's report is being prepared at AL President Sheikh Hasina's political office at Dhanmondi, said party leaders involved with the task. It was learnt that AL's Research and Information Secretary Nuh-ul-Alam Lenin is drafting the report.

On July 13, the AL Presidium suddenly decided to hold the party council on July 24 to ratify the provisional changes in its constitution to comply with the electoral laws on party registra- : the party. tion as well as elect new office bearers.

Laskar leader used Prankster fools media 6 mobiles for links

Maintained regular contacts in Pakistan, India

Detained Mufti Obaidullah, one of the most wanted Laskar-e-Taiyeba leaders in India, used six mobile phones and had regular contact with Ameer Reza, chief of Asif Reza Commando Force (ARCF) working with the Pakistan-based Islamist militant outfit, said Detective Branch (DB) of police sources.

Obaidullah on Friday told The Daily Star at the DB headquarters that he knew Ameer Reza quite well.

He had close relations with Ameer's brother Asif Reza, the founder of ARCF, who was killed in an encounter with law enforcers in Gujarat in 2001, said Obaidullah, who is fluent in Bengali, Hindi, Urdu and Persian languages.

DB officials said Obaidullah sent SMS to Ameer Reza and others in Pakistan in Parsian language using English alphabets. Meanwhile, Obaidullah, a madrasa teacher at Shibchar in Madaripur, was placed on a seven-day remand after DB police produced him before the Dhaka Metropolitan Magistrate's

Court with a 10-day remand prayer. SEE PAGE 15 COL 1

2 dead, 5 others of a family burnt

Survivors claim husband of a victim sets house on fire; police see electric short circuit

A minor girl and her cousin were killed and five others of the same family critically burnt when a fire broke out in their house in city's Kadamtali area in the early hours yesterday.

Police suspect the fire was caused by an electric short circuit, but family members allege that the husband of Shurovi -- one of the victims -- deliberately set fire to the house. Nine-year-old Liza Akter and her cousin Rubel Sardar, 22 --

who arrived only the day before on a visit to Dhaka -- died of their injuries shortly after they were rushed to the burn unit of Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH). The others injured are Dadan Sardar, 45, a vegetable vendor,


